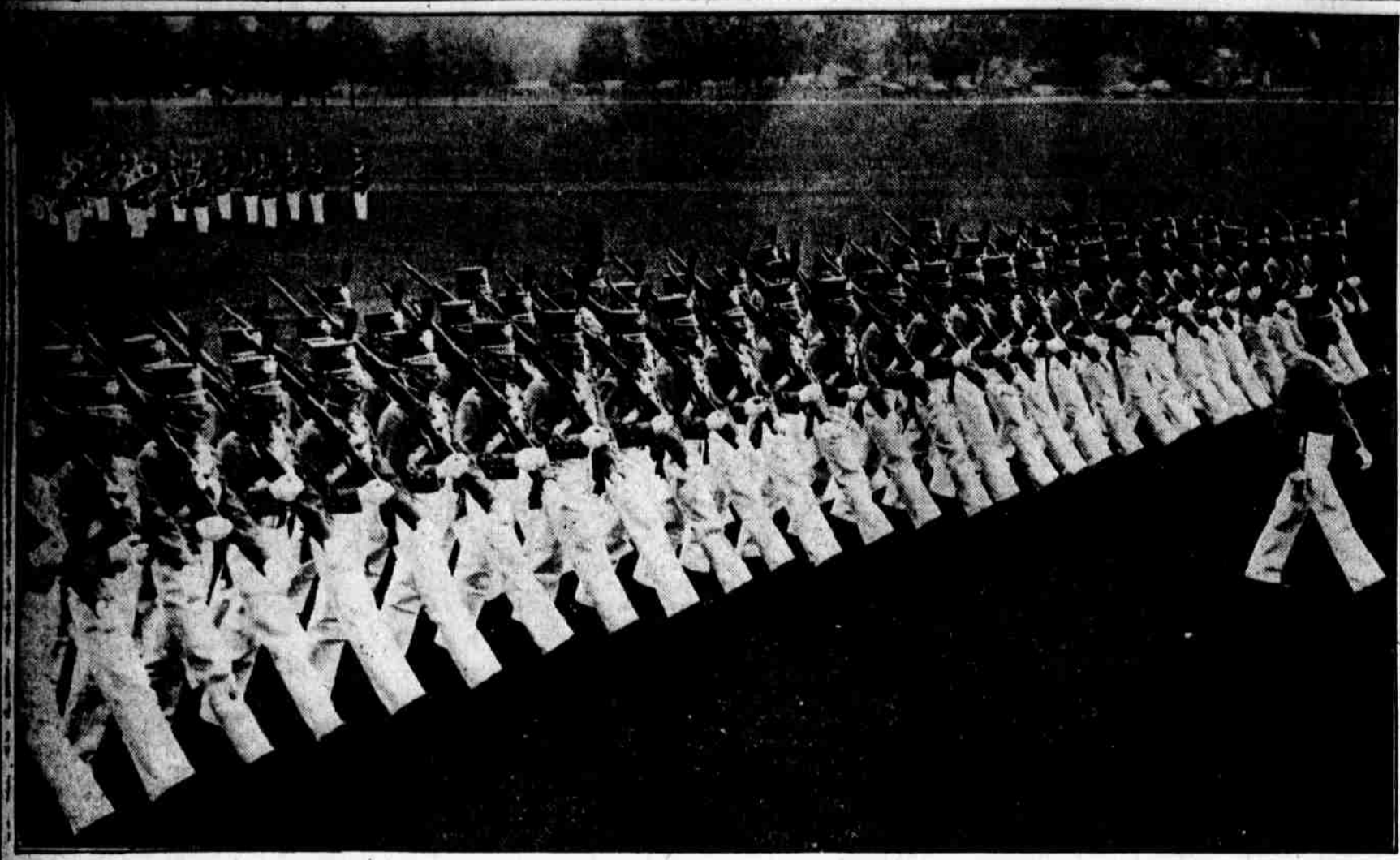

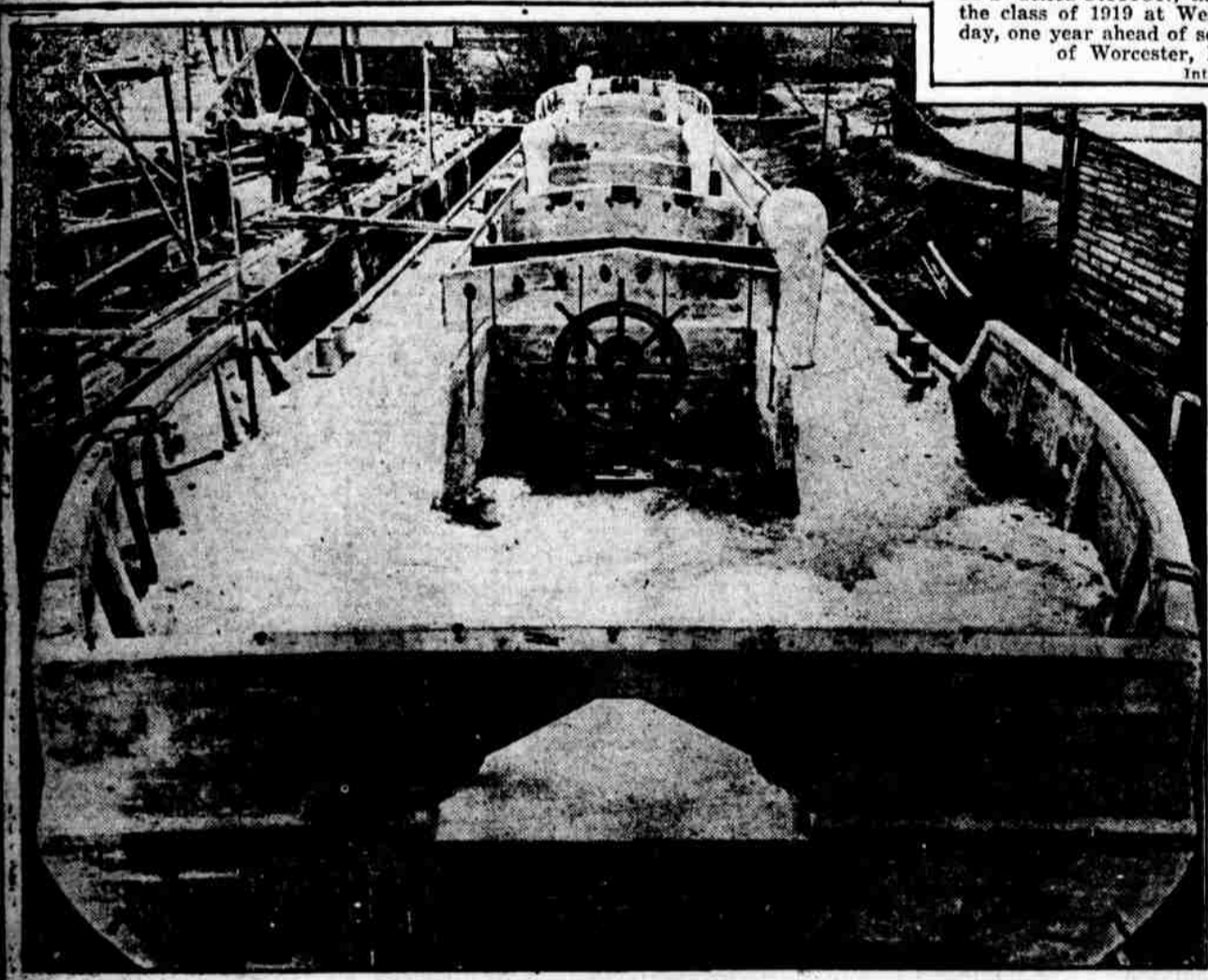
HERE, THERE AND EVERYWHERE THE CAMERA TURNS IN ILLUSTRATING THE DAY'S NEWS EVENTS

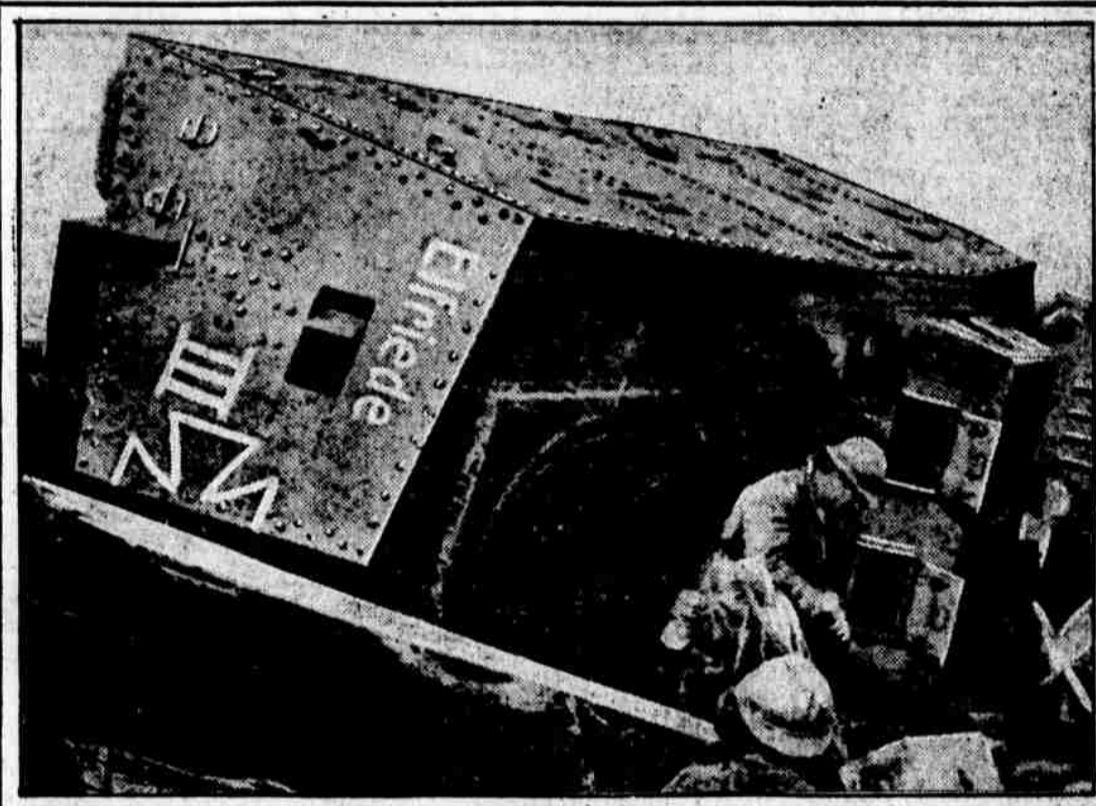

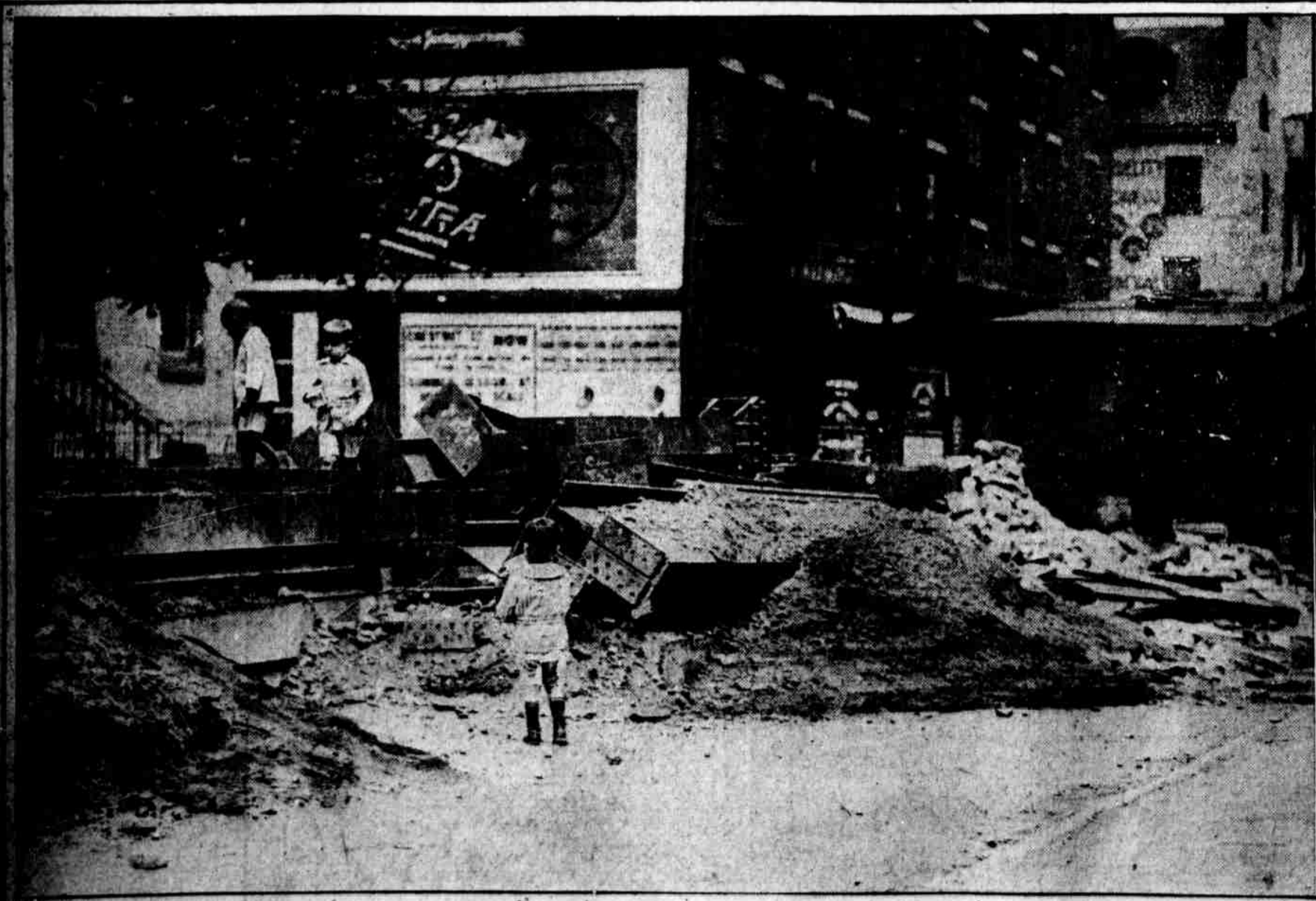
