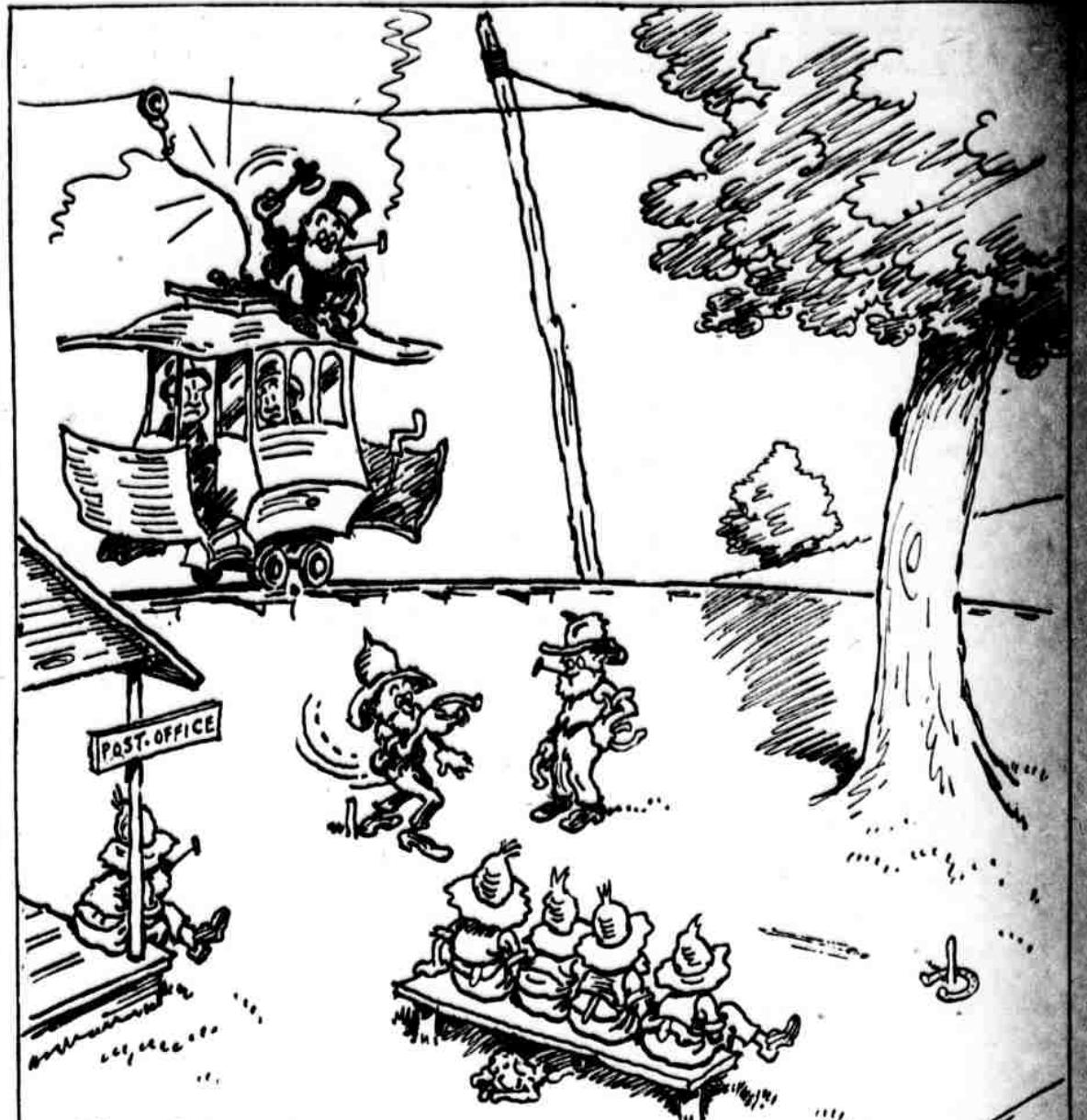

The young lady across the way says she does hope the coal shortage won't be so bad next winter that they'll expect her to save power by not running her electric limousine.

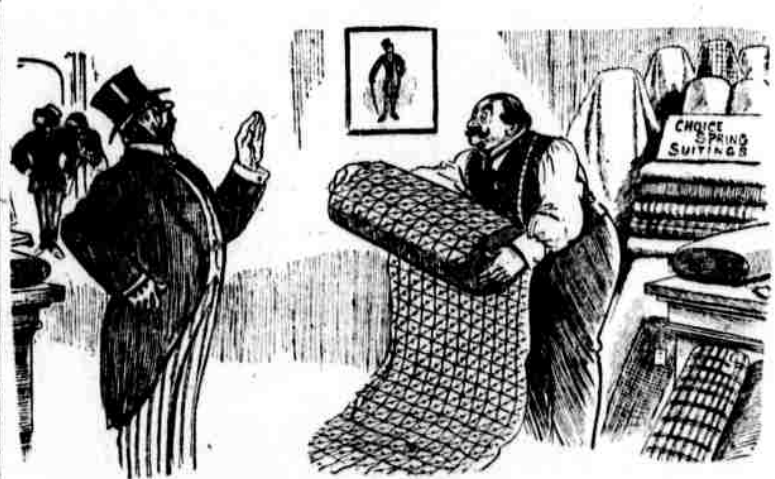
