NEW YORK STOCKS. HIGHER STOCK PRICES CREDITED TO CONFIDENCE ON ALLIED GAINS. Wall Street Sees Good Outlook for Victory and Peace in Continued Advances in France—Railroad Issues Are Strong.

The New York stock market was strong, although business was limited by volume of small supply. Wall Street credited strength to confidence in early victory and peace due to continued Allied successes. Curb issues were neglected. Bears were in control of the grain pit. Cotton made a sensational gain. Each exchange advanced to highest level for this year. Bar silver was unchanged.

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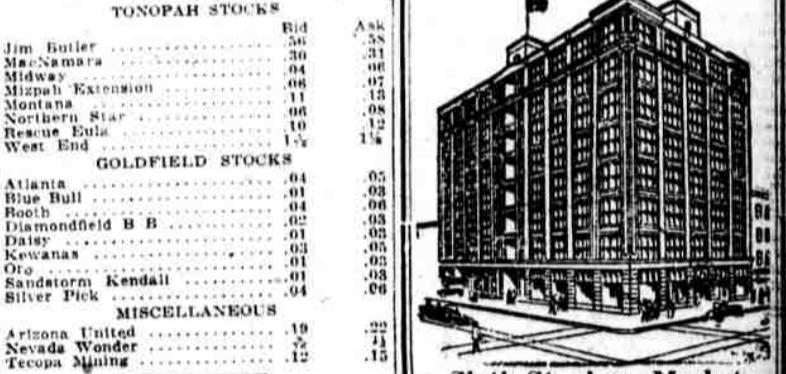
NEW YORK COFFEE MARKET. COFFEE FUTURES OPENED STEADY.
