Washington, Aug. 24. Benator Lodge's peace terms speech to be Senate was accepted today in Wash-ington political circles as the keynote of the Republican party for the rest of the

the Republican party for the rest of the war-and after. Jodge was, peculiarly his party's speceman. Today he was named Sen-ato Republican leader to succeed the late Senator Gallinger. His utterances guestions of national polley have always been exceedingly orthodox from the Republican point of view. These two things added weight to his words. Political observers in the Capitol said frankly the speech opened the Republi-can national campaign of 1920. The

can national campaign of 1920. The possibility that the peace treaty may be under way late in 1919 or early in 1920 was pointed out.

The speech was regarded as marking the end for the present at least of the Republican criticism of war policies and acceptance of the task of winning a com-plete victory first of all. It was a clear statement, of just what Lodge believes Appricans must establish as their right to demand. It pledged the Republican party to support any policy that will achieve those results and to oppose any policy. less vigorous or complete.

Speaking as the Republican leader, he took exception to the fourteen conditions of peace cnunciated by President Wilson or peace chunched by President Wilson in an address before a joint session of Congress of January 8, 1918, as being "varue," and he outlined ten specific conditions, which he deplared are the "irreductible minimum" upon which peace can be based."
