COAL SUBSTITUTE APPROVED

Fuel Administration Will Aid Manufacture of Bricketts

Manufacture of Bricketts

One of the coal substitutes that has been investigated by officials of the national fuel administration has proved so satisfactory that the Government is interested in the building of a plant for its manufacture at Clinchfield, Va., it was announced at the fuel administration here this afternoon.

The plant will be completed within about six months. The output is to be utilized by the Government and probably will be burned by vessels in the navy.

The product, which is in the form of bricketts, is obtained by treating a low grade of bituminous coal with a new low temperature distillation method, which removes the valuable by-products. The residue is compressed into bricks, and tests made by the Navy Department have shown it to produce as much heat as ordinary fuel and to be particularly valuable because it is virtually smokeless.
