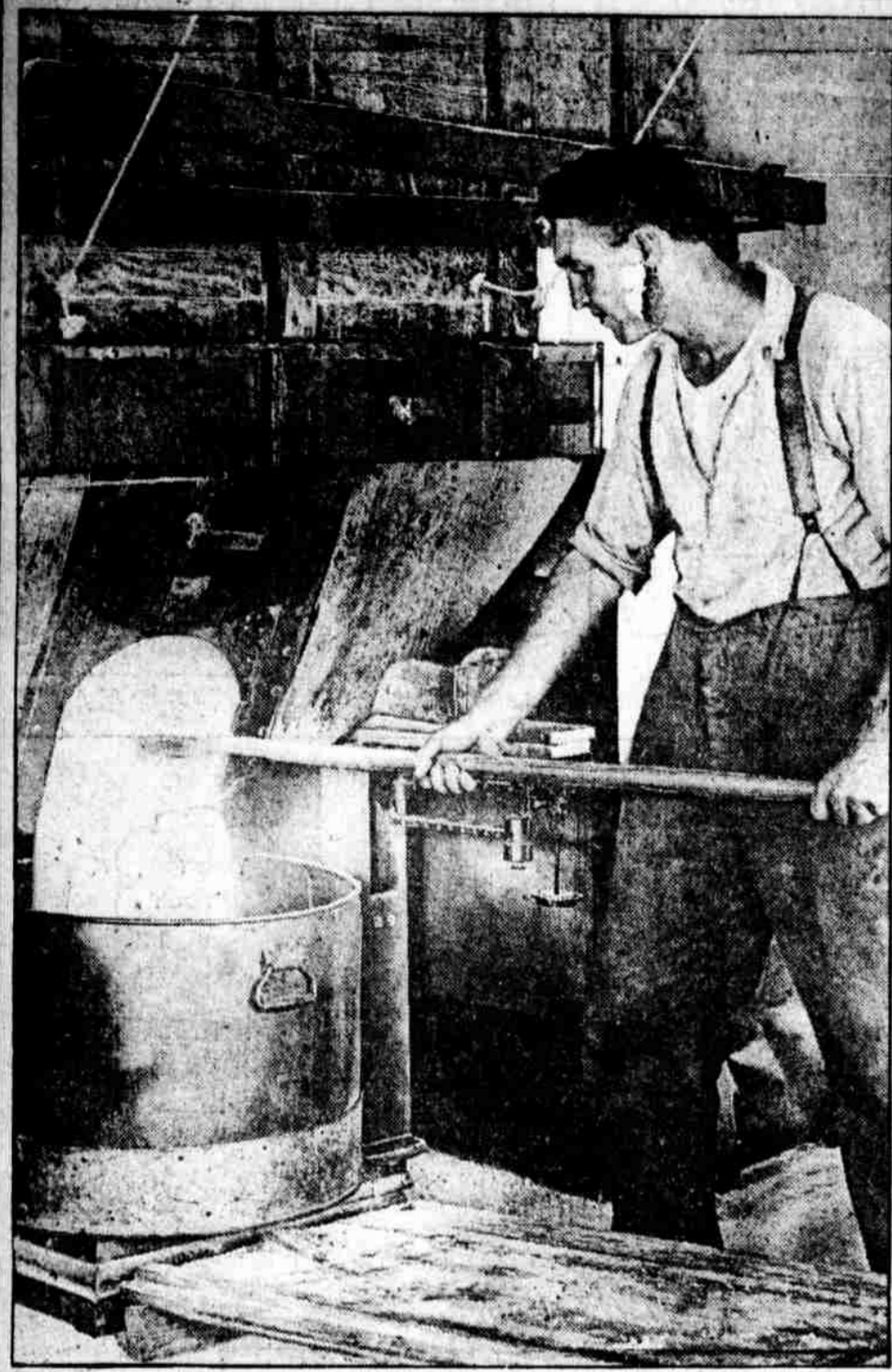
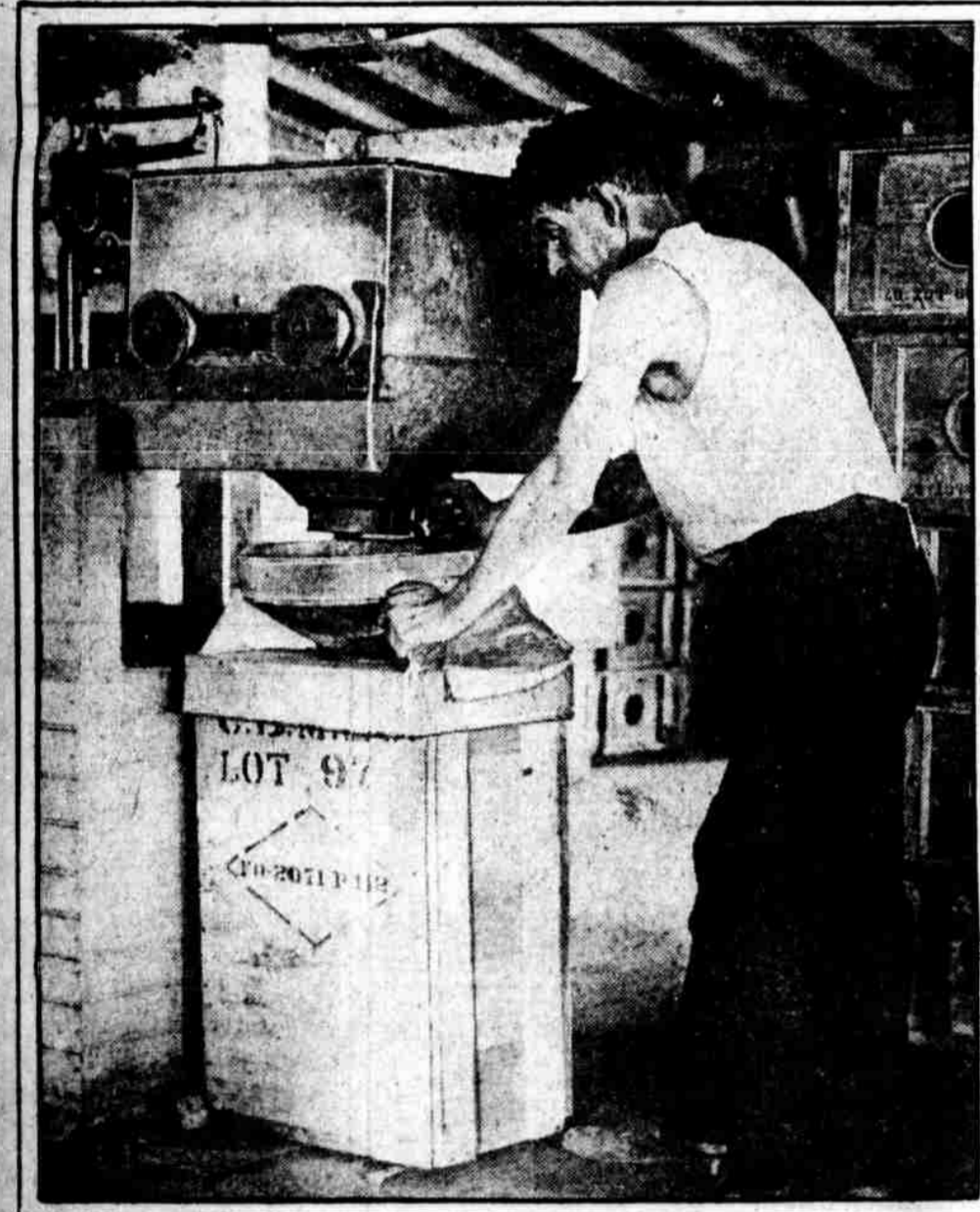


MANUFACTURING GUNCOTTON TO DISCOMFORT THE KAISER AT THE DU PONT CARNEY'S POINT PLANT



WHITE LIKE SUGAR the raw guncotton comes from the factory and enters upon its last journey before shipment.



THE MECHANICAL PROCESS extends even to the packing of the cases of guncotton for shipment to the bag-loading plants.

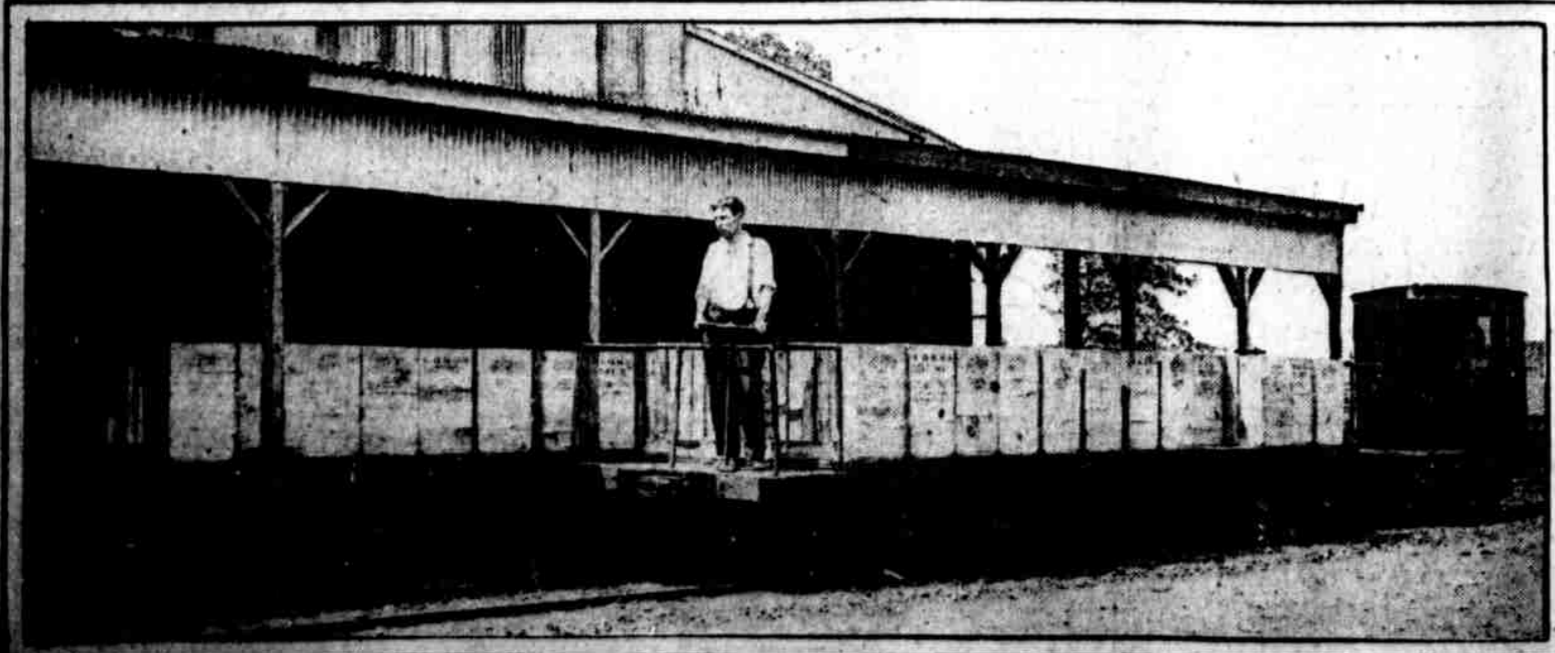
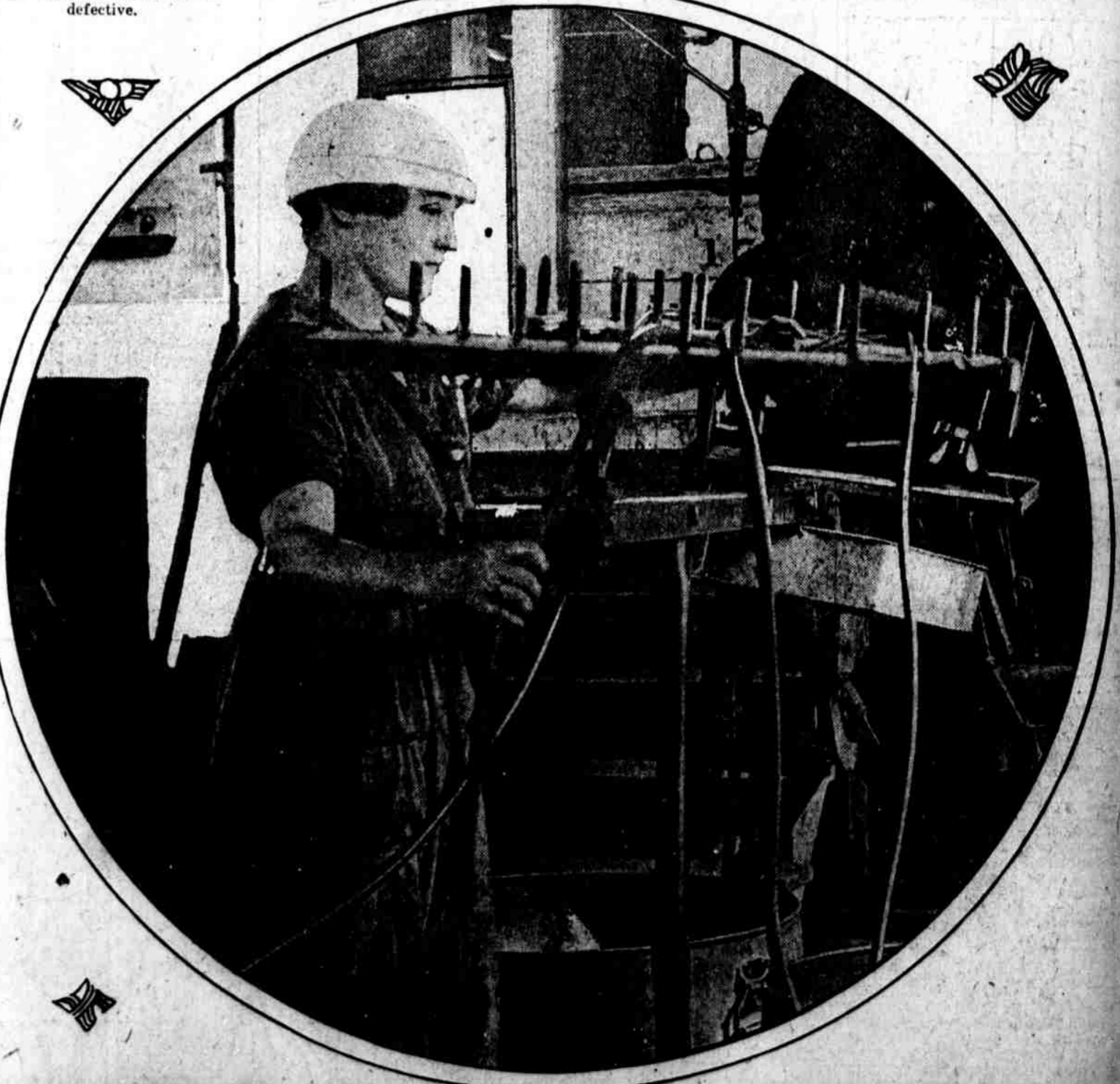


A REVIEW OF THE WORK of the Carneys Point plant would not be complete without a picture of H. F. Harrington, its general manager.

INTO A PRESSING MACHINE goes the granulated powder and emerges in chocolate-colored cakes, which presently find their way into the cutting machine, there to be converted into the convenient sizes.



CUT INTO PROPER SIZES the pieces of guncotton pour from the slicing machine while the capable girl to the right watches that none is defective.



READY FOR THE KAISER, the cases of guncotton are shipped in carload lots, and the work of the Carneys Point plant is complete.

HERE IS THE CUTTING MACHINE and its fair operator, who is backing up the boys "over there."
