PUT UP GRAPE JUICE THE DAILY NOVELETTE FOR WINTER DESSERTS

Is Easy to Make and Requires No Sugar-Process Is **Given Here**

In the face of the sugar shortage the small grape arboritakes on a new light. The patriotic grower will lock into the which is made without sugar, and which is so wholesome used as a beverage or in desserts of one kind and another. Only clean, sound well-ripened but not overripe grapes should be used These may be crushed and pressed either by hand or in an ordinary cider mill. If a light-colored juice is desired, the crushed grapes are put in a clean, well-washed cloth suck and either hung up and twisted or grasped by two per possibilities of home-nrade grape juice, which is made without sugar, and which is so wholesome used as a beverage or up and twisted or grasped by two per sons, one at either end, and twisted until the greater part of the juice is expressed. To Test an Oven

Test an oven without a thermometer by putting in a piece of thick white paper and shut the door. If in three minutes the paper is very dark the oven is very hot; if hardly brown, cool; if golden brown the heat is moderate. Regulate the heat of the oven by plac-ing the food that needs the gentler heat over the shelf, and vice versa. Cover the dish with greased paper or a plate, or stand it in a pan of water as you find necessary.




