Harold Kruger Also Establishes New Mark at Columbia Club Two local swimming records went by the boards last night in the Columbia lub's pool, Broad and Oxford street, at the Red Cross swimming show, given by the great Hawaiian swimming team, which were assisted by the best local alent, both men and women champions, in a fine natatorial treat.

Harold Kruger, the world's record includer at back-stroke swimming, covered to yards in 1 minute 9 seconds, or

100 yards in 1 minute 9 seconds, or within four-fifths of a second of his own

100 yards in 1 minute 2 seconds, or within four-fifths of a second of his own world's record.

Clarence Lane beat Raymond Uhl, the local speed champion, at fifty yards in 24 2-5 seconds, the time being one second faster than the Middle Atlantic Association mark for the distance, made by Henri E. Scott, of the Argo Swimming Club, January 27, 1912

The other record went in the 200-yard race between Kahanamoku, the big Hawaiian speed king, and Ernest W. Sopp, of the United States navy, when the Duke covered the distance in 2 minutes 12 seconds, shattering the mark of 2 minutes 20 2-5 seconds set up at West Branch Y. M. C. A. February 2, 1915, by Robert N. Dippy, now a l'eutenant in the United States service abroad.

A ladies' 100-yard handleap was won by Florence McLaughlin, First Regiment Swimming Club, the elapsed time showing 1 minute 25 2-5 seconds. 
