

Where Men of 18 to 45 Can Register Next Thursday for Draft

Announcement was made today of the official registration places for the enrollment Thursday of every eligible from eighteen to forty-five years, inclusive, who have not already registered.

The list contains the addresses of 1302 registration bureaus, which will be open Thursday, between 7 a. m. and 9 p. m. For the most part they are at the regular polling places.

Registrants may enroll at any bureau designated by the local board of their respective district, although to avoid congestion the eligibles are requested to select the one nearest home.
