

66 U. S. CASUALTIES REPORTED ON 3 LISTS

Army Loses 172 Soldiers Killed in Action, Marine Corps Eight—92 Other Deaths Announced. 112 Pershing Men Missing

Washington, Sept. 11.—Three hundred and twenty names appear on the army casualty list announced today, twenty-four on the list of the marine corps and 322 on the army list given out last night, making a total of 666 names on the three reports.

Today's army list is divided as follows: Killed in action, thirty-four; missing in action, fifty-eight; wounded severely, 118; died of wounds, thirty-six; died in airplane accident, one; died of disease, seven; wounded (degree undetermined), sixteen.

The twenty-four marine corps casualties are divided as follows: Killed in action, eight; died of wounds, five; died of disease, one; wounded severely, four; wounded (degree undetermined), five; wounded slightly, one. These make a total of 3063 marine corps casualties to date, as follows: Officers, deaths, thirty-seven; wounded, sixty-three; missing, one; enlisted men, deaths, 94; wounded, 184; in hands of enemy, missing, 184.

Last night's army list of 322 included: Killed in action, eighty-eight; missing in action, fifty-four; wounded severely, 118; died of wounds, thirty-six; died from accident, one; died of disease, five; wounded (degree undetermined), twenty.

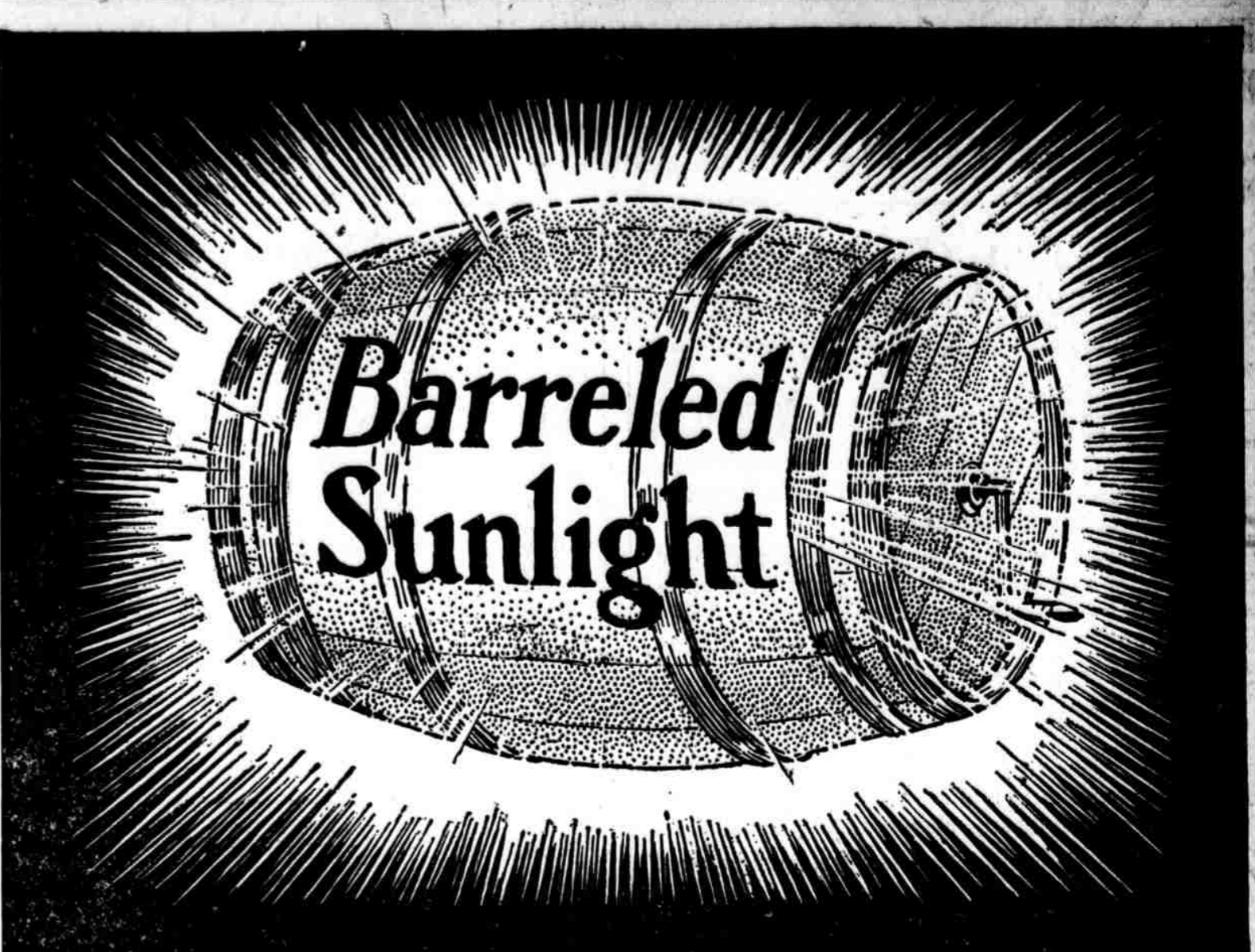
