SURRENDERS HIS ART TO DO A MAN'S PART

Sculptor Devotes His Skill to Humble Shipyard Task
When the time comes to write into history the labor side of the war, F. E. Triebel, an American sculptor, will be given a "place in the sun." He is now at Hog Island making linen tracings from blue prints, when he might be commanding big prices for his art.

The Japanese Government bought all this artist's work for the World's Fair in Chicago. Mr. Triebel went into the shipyard "inco" preferring to be known just as a plain American workman doing his part to win the war. It was only by accident that he was unmasked very recently and "fessed up."

Early in August the sculptor left his family and the home at College Point, L. I., to start on a hunt for a man's work among the masses of workmen. First he went to Washington and made himself known to a few high officials he thought might help him. There was no need for sculptors in this war. Then the sculptor realized that he had to be something else to get a real war job.

workman's clothes he went to Hog Island, and tackled the employment office manager. There he said he was a stone cutter. And that failed, but they found a place for him in the riveting shop. The artist went to it in good American style. He found the work a bit heavy, but held on to it until an accident threw another and better job in his way.

While looking over a flannel desk in an office one day Mr. Triebel saw in a tracing "I can do this and work." He was one of the draftsmen. They gave him a blueprint and a sheet of linen paper and his work was so good they had him transferred from the riveting shop.

So he has been tracing in the hull fabrication room ever since, and there he is perfectly satisfied to remain as long as he may be needed. Money is no object with this worker.

"Who's Who" devotes almost a page to Mr. Triebel and his achievements in the world. Born in Peoria, Ill., in 1865, he entered upon his career just in time to get in on the World's Fair. He did most of the sculpting for the fair. Mr. Triebel was graduate of the Royal Academy of Fine Arts, Florence, Italy, in 1888. It is doubtful if there is another case like his in any of the shipyards. "I want to be known simply as one of the workmen in this place," he said.
