

# U. S. CASUALTY LISTS FOR DAY TOTAL 196

War Department Announces 178 Names on Two Army Reports and 18 Among Marines—Six Killed in Action—75 Missing

Washington, Sept. 16. A total of 196 names appear on army and marine corps casualty lists announced by the War Department today and an army list given out last night. Each of the army reports has eighty-nine names and that of the marine corps eighteen.

Today's army list is divided as follows: Missing in action, 32; wounded severely, 45; died of disease, 1; wounded, degree undetermined, 4; died from wounds, 7.

The marine corps list includes: Killed in action, 2; wounded severely, 2; wounded, degree undetermined, 4; missing in action, 10. These make a total of 3086 casualties among the marines to date. They are divided as follows: Officers, deaths, 37; wounded, 64; missing, 1. Enlisted men, deaths, 812; wounded, 1919; in hands of Germany, 11; missing, 141.

Last night's army list reported: Killed in action, 4; missing in action, 23; wounded severely, 45; wounded, degree undetermined, 5; died from accident and other causes, 2.
