

NEARBY SOLDIERS MISSING IN ACTION

136 Men From Pennsylvania and Neighboring States in Double Casualty List of 300 and 304 Names Announced by War Department

Washington, Sept. 27. Army casualty lists announced today and last night contain 300 and 304 names, respectively. Fifty-five men from Pennsylvania and nearby states are reported missing in action. Today's list includes: Killed in action, 61; missing in action, 63; wounded severely, 73; died of disease, 9; died of accident and other causes, 4; died from wounds, 62; wounded slightly, 5.

Last night's list is divided as follows: Killed in action, 87; missing in action, 61; wounded severely, 73; died from wounds, 67; died from airplane accident, 1; died from accident and other causes, 8; died of disease, 12; wounded, degree undetermined, 3.

The summary of the army casualties to date follows: Killed in action 6534, Wounded 18,282, Lost at sea 291, Died of wounds 2100, Died of accident and other causes 898, Died of disease 1855.

Total deaths 11,678, Wounded 18,282, Missing, including prisoners 6044, Grand total 34,994
