#### Pennington Machine Gunner Tells of Shooting Boches Down

#### LIQUID FIRE FAILED Nothing Could Stop the Americans at Fismette, He Writes Home

Some idea of the terrible toll the Pennington machine gunners have taken of the German ranks is given by Albert I. Pennington, of Phoenixville, a member of Company D, 11th Infantry. He writes in a letter to his mother that he and one other man in his company were the first to take a machine gun to the front at Fismette, and one paragraph in his letter to his mother says:

"I killed my first German at 6 a. m. and got my second at 6:20. After that I took my machine gun, and I would have had to have a half-dozen fellows to come to me, as they were going over the line. I would rather do that work than any I ever did, if it were not for the big shells."

"Every man in our battalion was ordered to death, but we held our nerve." The Germans used liquid fire, poison gas, bombs and hand grenades, but they were useless against the Americans, he says.

Walter Kerbaugh, a Neaquehoning soldier, has been commissioned a lieutenant in France for bravery in battle. Harry S. H. Hensack, of Southampton, Bucks County, rescued two comrades, carrying them through heavy shellfire while wounded himself. For this performance he has been recommended for a distinguished service medal.

Charles H. Carroll, of West Fairview, was killed at Chateau-Thierry. Ten days ago his parents learned that another son, Owen M. Carroll, was killed August 27.

Lieutenant Charles "Pat" O'Brien, football coach and well-known athlete of Wilkes-Barre, was killed in action September 5. He was a graduate of three officers' training schools, but was twice rejected. He served with the 89th Infantry and was killed while leading his men against enemy trenches by a rifle bullet, which pierced his brain. He was an assistant football coach at Bucknell University.

#### TOLD OF HERO SON'S DEATH

Parents Notified After Clyde Coleman Is Slain

Mr. and Mrs. A. V. Coleman, of Pocomo, formerly of West Pittston, Pa., have been officially notified of the death of their son, Clyde, on the field of battle.

The government message was followed by a letter from Claude Newhart, a friend of Coleman, which stated that he was standing beside the young man when a German shell exploded nearby and killed him. Newhart was uninjured.

Private Coleman was twenty-four years old. When the trouble with Mexico broke out he enlisted in Schwab's company at the Bethlehem Steel Works, where he was employed. He saw service on the border. Schwab's company was later transferred to Battery A, 107th Light Field Artillery, and was trained at Camp Hancock, Ga., for overseas service. Private Coleman sailed for France on May 7, 1918, and served as a first class cook until his death.
