

### 973 CASUALTIES ON THREE LISTS

Army Loses 103 Men Killed in Action—Marine Corps One

OTHER DEATHS TOTAL 99

Washington, Oct. 4.

Casualties among the American expeditionary forces in France announced by the War Department today and last night total 973. There were 473 names on last night's army list and 489 on the report given out today. Eleven names appear on the list of the marine corps.

Today's army list includes: Killed in action, 48; missing in action, 86; wounded severely, 287; died of disease, 10; died of accident and other causes, 2; died from wounds, 46; prisoner, 1; wounded slightly, 2; wounded, degree undetermined, 6.
