7010 DIE OF GRIP IN PENNSYLVANIA SINCE OCTOBER 1

Pneumonia Adds 3076 Deaths to List, Setting New Record

CITY LOSES 711 IN DAY

Fatalities Decrease, but 1888 New Cases Are Reported, Advance of 202

Pennsylvania's death rate for the first half of this month has doubled because of the influenza epidemic.

From October 1 to October 15, there were in this State 7010 deaths caused by influenza and 3076 caused by pneumonia, State Commissioner of Health Royer announced today. This total is equal to the normal death rate for an entire month in this State.

Deaths in Philadelphia are now decreasing. Although 711 deaths were reported for the twenty-four hours ending at noon yesterday a number of them really occurred in the preceding days. Undertakers buried the dead first and applied for death certificates afterwards, a sanctioned procedure, and the official death rate was computed from the death certificate applications.

New Cases Increased

A slight increase in the number of new cases of influenza was reported for the last twenty-four hours. The total was 1888, an increase of 202 over the preceding twenty-four hours. The 1888 new cases reported were distributed as follows: North of Market street, 788; south of Market street, 382; West Philadelphia, 552; and Germantown, 155.

Will Provide Nurses
