

CASUALTIES ADD TO HONOR ROLL

U. S. Soldiers Gallantly Uphold Traditions of Valor on Battlefield

43 KILLED IN ACTION

235 Wounded and Lists of Today and Last Night Swell Total by 351 Names

Washington, Oct. 18.—In General Pershing's casualty report of today and last night appear 351 names, a marked reduction from the totals of several days past. They contain a percentage from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland that indicates most clearly the gallant part the boys from this region are playing at the front.

The summary of the marine corps casualties follows: Deaths 1,199; Wounded, including prisoners 2,382; Missing, including prisoners 144. Total 4,725.
