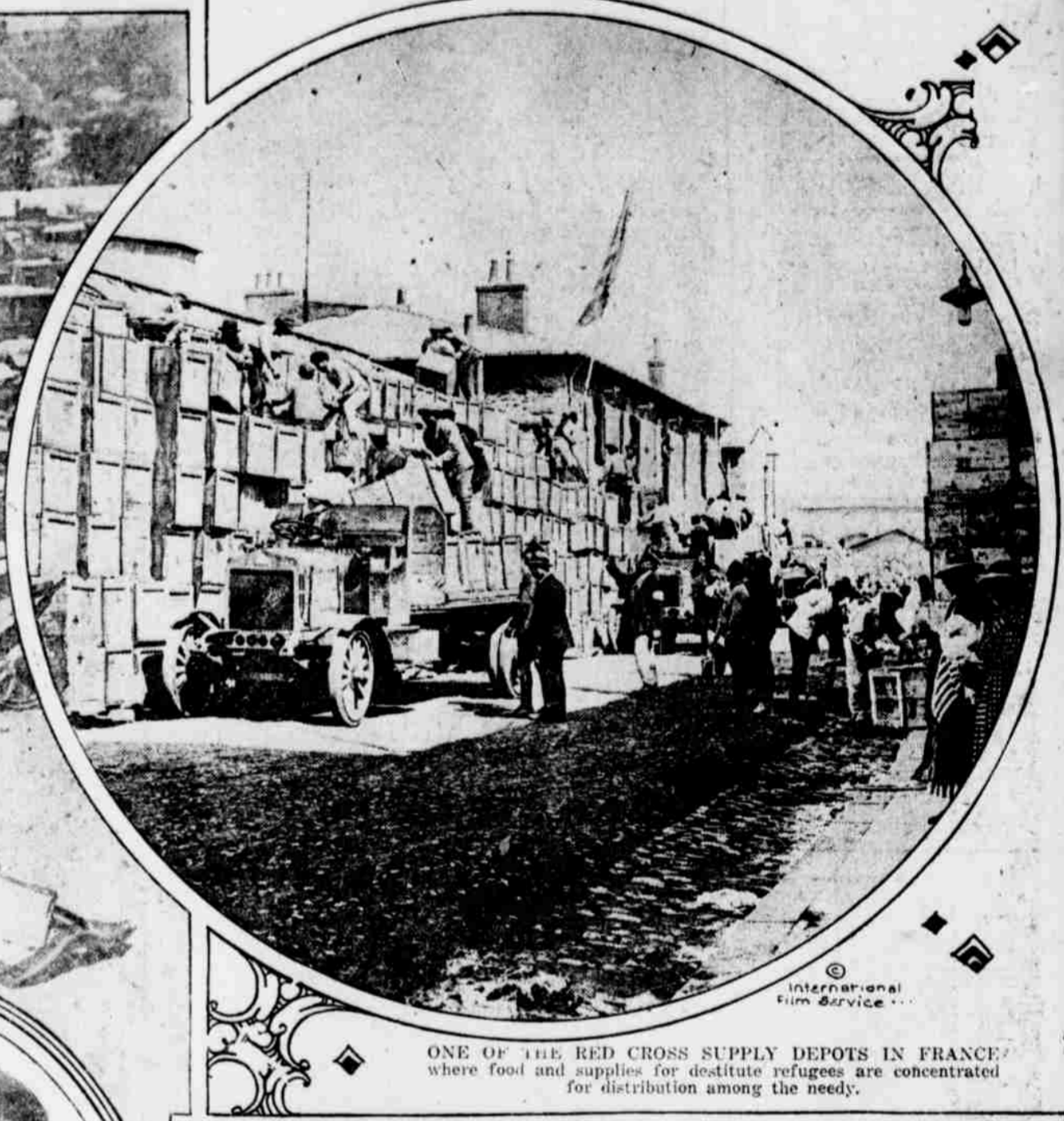


ON BUSY HIGHWAYS, NEAR AND FAR, THE CAMERA GLEANS THE FEATURES OF INTEREST

ONE OF THE RED CROSS SUPPLY DEPOTS IN FRANCE where food and supplies for destitute refugees are concentrated for distribution among the needy.



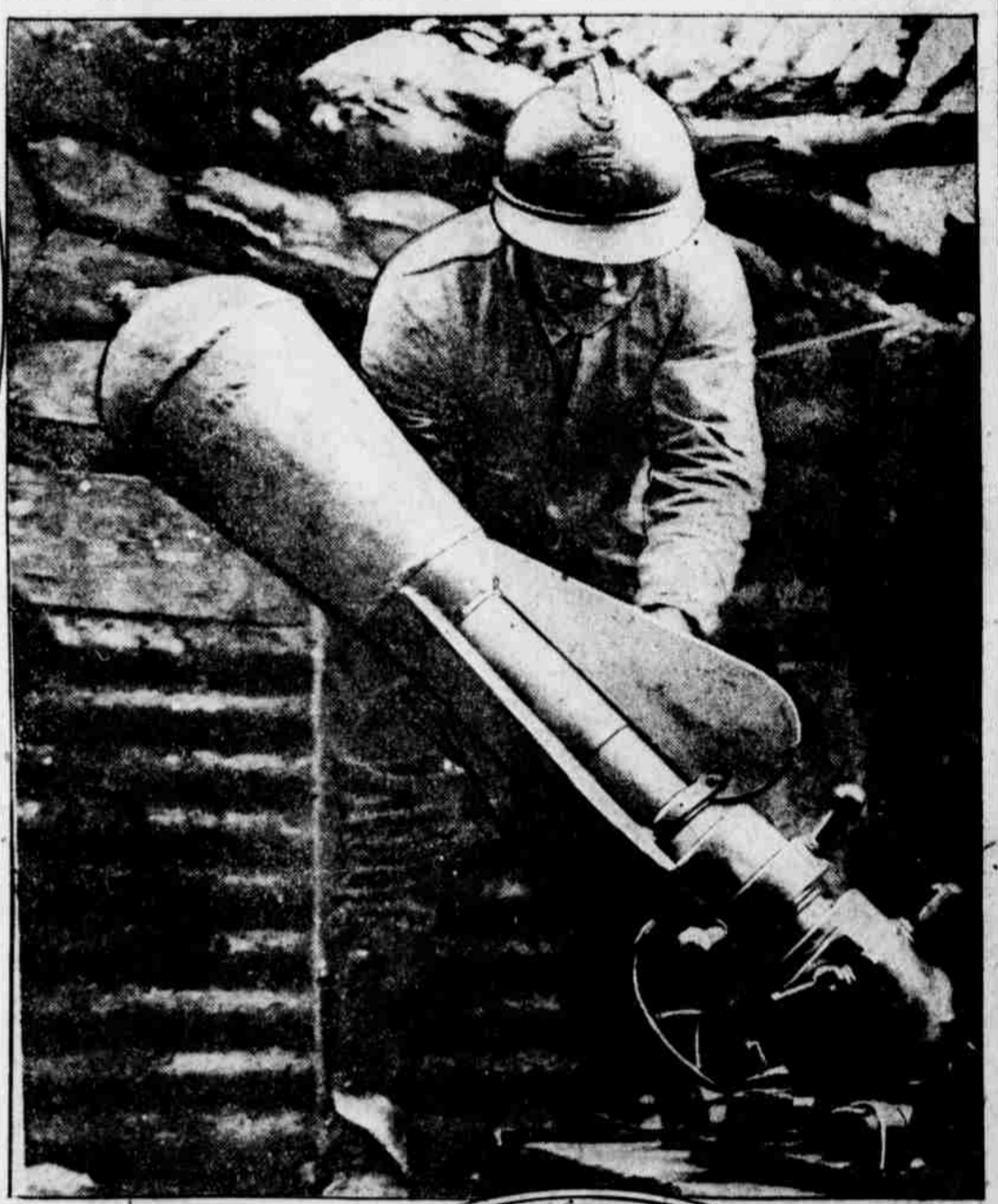
CHARLES PIEZ, THE ENERGETIC MANAGER OF THE EMERGENCY FLEET CORPORATION, "snapped" on Broad street.



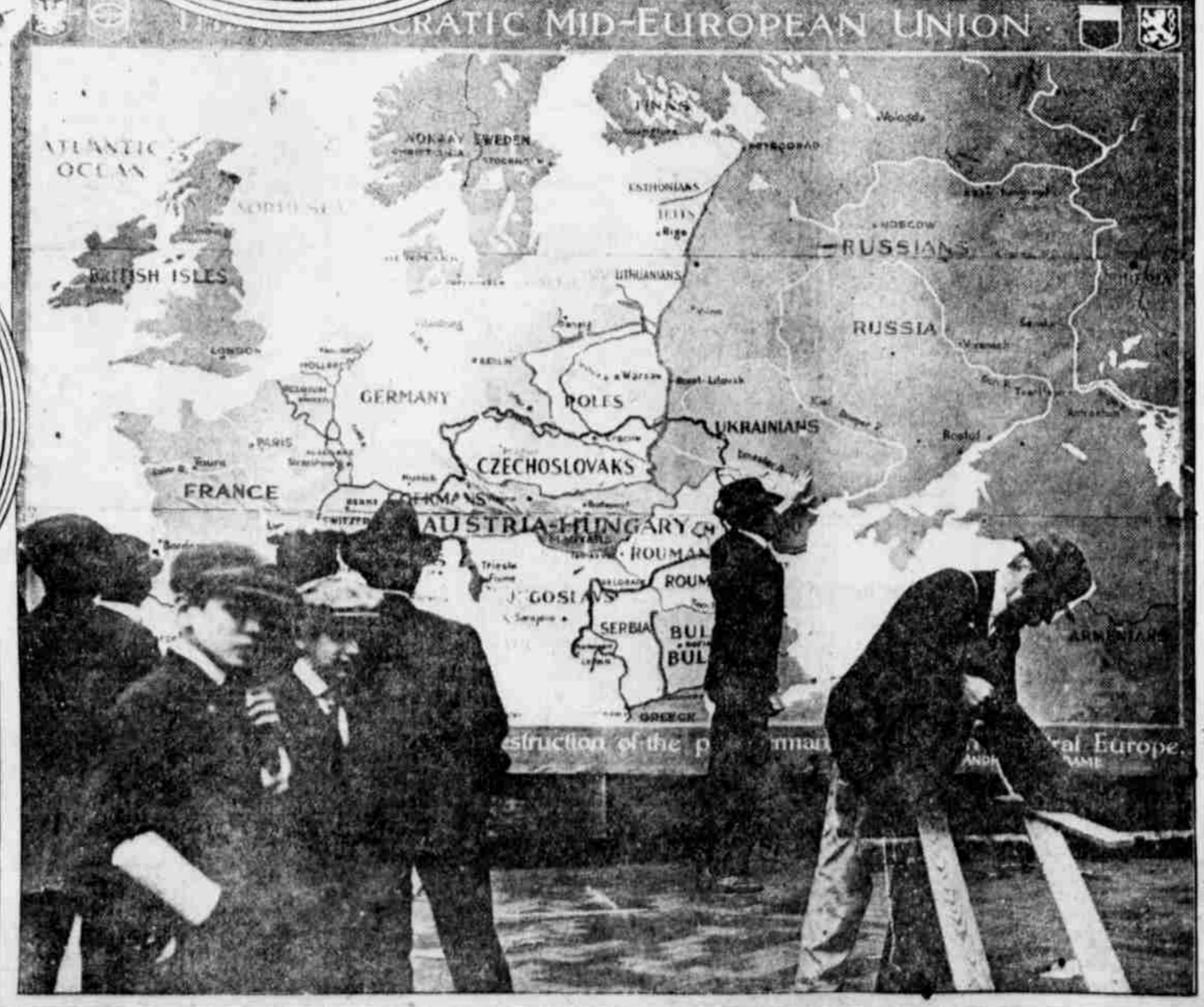
DR. THOMAS MASARYK
