**Shortest Roll of U. S. Losses in Weeks Announced for Today**

**41 MARINES REPORTED**

**Many Nearby Soldiers Are Listed—Six Lose Lives in Battle**

Washington, Oct. 24. The shortest casualty list from the United States' forces in weeks appeared today and contains 255 names, of which 41 were on a Marine roll. Many on today's honor roll are from Pennsylvania and nearby States. Only 5 are listed as killed in action.

There were 105 names on today's list and 109 on last night's report. With the Marine roll, these casualties are classified as follows: Killed in action, 5; died of disease, 29; wounded in action, 191; died of wounds, 5; missing in action, 21.

**L'OFFENSIVA ITALIANA CONTINUA VITTORIOSA**

**Gli Austriaci Sloggiati da Importanti Posizioni e Subiscono Gravi Perdite**

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Londra, 25 ottobre

Tutte le notizie, inglesi e francesi hanno lanciato una nuova offensiva lungo la fronte delle montagne in Italia, tra il fiume Brenta e Piave, e nonostante le condizioni atmosferiche sfavorevoli le operazioni procedono con considerevole successo. Gli ultimi rapporti annunciano la cattura di circa 3000 prigionieri.

Gli italiani, durante la giornata di ieri, avanzarono contro il fiume Orto nel settore di Monte Grappa e catturarono Monte Solarolo, parte del Monte Prassalon e Monte Petica. Sul fronte del Piave gli inglesi hanno occupato alcune isole del fiume catturando le guarnigioni nemiche ammontanti a 400 uomini.

Sull'altipiano di Asiago i francesi hanno preso monte Sismol, aumentando il numero dei prigionieri da loro catturati ad 800.

Il Quartier Generale Italiano ha pubblicato ieri il seguente comunicato: "Accenti combattimenti si verificarono ieri mattina nella regione di Monte Grappa. I reparti di nostre truppe risolutamente attaccarono alcune posizioni delle formidabili posizioni nemiche, e con successo sloggiarono l'avversario e mantennero il possesso di importanti punti nell'area meridionale ed occidentale del massiccio. Gli italiani si stabilirono sulla riva nordica del torrente Orto e nel bacino di Asiago. Il nemico, che cercò una rigorosa resistenza, ebbe a soffrire considerevoli perdite."

"Alcune piccole isole a Grave di Papadopoli, sul fiume Piave, furono occupate e le guarnigioni catturate."

"Nel settore Polesina-Asolo e nella Valle Asa i nostri avanzati nemici furono distrutti. Sull'altipiano di Asiago pattuglie nostre ed Alleate effettuarono con successo un piccolo attacco di sorpresa."

"Il numero totale dei prigionieri catturati dalla messanotte del 23 ottobre a quella del 24 ottobre, e di ottantaquattro ufficiali e 2781 uomini di truppe."
