Pershing's Total Includes 179 Dead in Action, 151 From Other Causes

WOUNDED NUMBER 110

Grand Total to Date Reaches 69,528—Heroes From Here and Nearby

Washington, Nov. 11.—General Pershing's report of losses in the American army included 179 killed in action and 151 died from disease and other causes. The wounded number 110, swelling today's total to 440 and the grand total of all casualties to date to 69,528.

Summarized losses by date are: (Imported Nov. 11) Killed in action 179, Died of wounds 151, Died of disease 151, Died of accidents and other causes 151, Missing in action 151, Wounded 110.

AUSTRALIA'S PREMIER CRITICIZES 14 POINTS

Doesn't Want Article Three to Limit Dominion's Differential Tariff

London, Nov. 11.—Premier W. M. Hughes, of Australia, took issue yesterday with 14 points of President Wilson's fourteen points. He expressed his opinion that the points should not be made correspondent to the Allies as a whole, but to the first three, which he said were the rights of small nations, and that small nations also should have their own.

Then, Hughes asked why no provision had been made for Germany's indemnity for the Allies for the cost of the war. Australia's war debt was \$1,500,000,000, and he could not see why she should be burdened with it when Germany had not been fighting for the Allies. Indemnification would be a heavy burden on the Allies.

Want German Islands

Mr. Hughes declared that the holding over of Germany's Pacific islands in the neighborhood of Australia to her own people, would be a serious disadvantage to the Allies. Germany Must Pay

Advised President Hughes's contention that Germany should be required, in addition to making reparation to Australia citizens for private injuries received at the hands of the enemy, to foot the bill for the cost of the war. Lord Robert said: "That will be a matter for the peace conference, and some estimate of the injuries done to private interests are being made.
