Bomb Hits Dugout Where Philadelphia Boy Sits Writing

24 FROM HERE DEAD

Eleven Killed in Action, Eight Die of Wounds and Six of Disease

A message Corporal Aloysius T. King of this city, was writing to his mother in a dugout on the front when it was hit by a bomb which killed six of the twenty-four men in the dugout.

There are 1441 names on the combined casualty lists today, including eleven killed in action, eight died of wounds and six of disease. Two have been severely wounded and seven have been severely wounded.

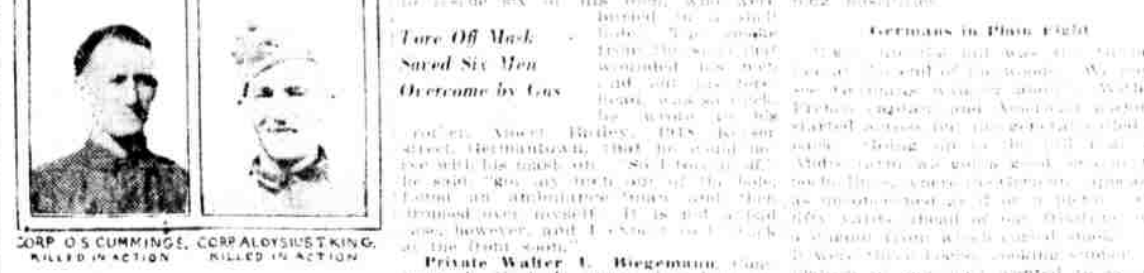
