

REVISED REVENUE BILL IS TAKEN UP

McAdoo May Explain \$6,000,000,000 Bill to Senators Today

EXPENSES STILL HIGH

Secretary of Treasury, Reversing Former Attitude, Favors Installments

By the Associated Press. Washington, Nov. 14.—The revised revenue bill, which the Treasury Department expects to introduce today, will yield \$6,000,000,000 in additional revenue during the calendar year 1919, but not less than \$1,000,000,000, according to Secretary McAdoo's statement today.
