The police are searching today for the driver of an automobile, bearing a New Jersey license tag, which struck and perhaps fatally injured an unidentified man at Twenty-third and Dickinson streets yesterday.

Witnesses of the accident say the driv-er faced away, leaving his victim lying unconnclous in the street. The car bore the name of a Wildwood, N. J. express-man. The injured man, though uniden-tified, had in his pockets a book bearing the name of "Edwards" and a Callowthe name of "Edwards," and a Callowhill street address west of Twenty-second street. He was taken to the Howard

Hospital, where surgeons report his condition critical. Place name and address of sender on all mail matter.

Pack articles carefully and wrap them securely. Do not seal. Sealed parcels are subject to postage at the letter rate.

Mail parcels early. They may be marked "Do not open until Christmas."

Insure valuable parcels. Inscriptions such as "Merry Christ-mas" are permissible additions to fourth-class (parcel post) mail.


