PHYSICAL TRAINING URGED

Examination of School Children Advised as Result of War Experience

Chicago, Dec. 10.—(By A. P.)—The high percentage of men rejected as physically unfit for military service was taken as the basis for a demand for compulsory physical examination of school children and their compulsory physical training in an address today before the American Public Health Association by James A. Snyder, of Baltimore, Md.

An average of 70 per cent of those examined under selective service regulations were rejected, according to his figures, and 60 per cent of those examined for the navy and volunteers for the army were likewise rejected.

Surgeon General Rupert Blue, of the Public Health Service, in an address pointed out the need of special vigilance on the part of health authorities in order to prevent the introduction and spread of dangerous epidemic diseases by our returning soldiers.

Public health officials and army officers are on the eve of a program for reports on measures to check and control influenza epidemics by face masks and prophylactics.
