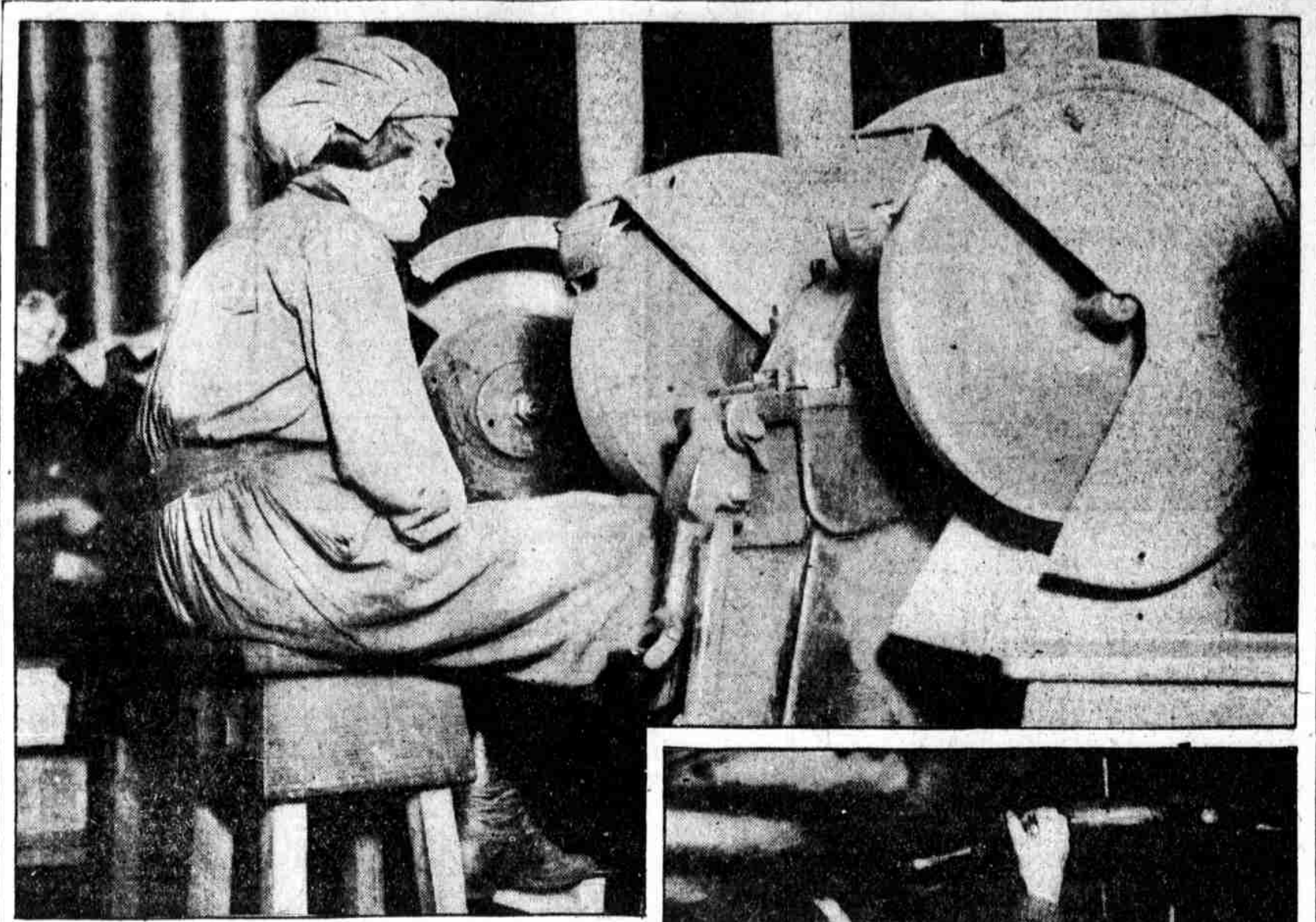

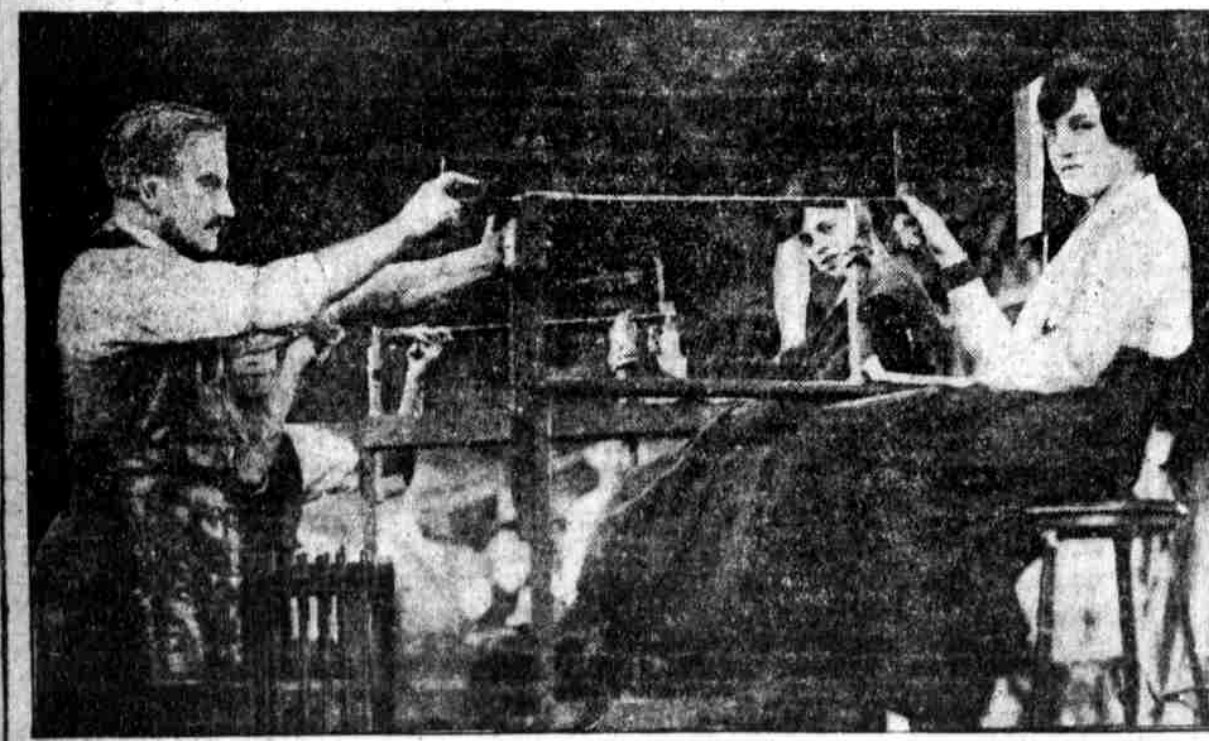

GIRL WORKERS Are Numerous and Get the Same Piece-Work Rates as Men Employees



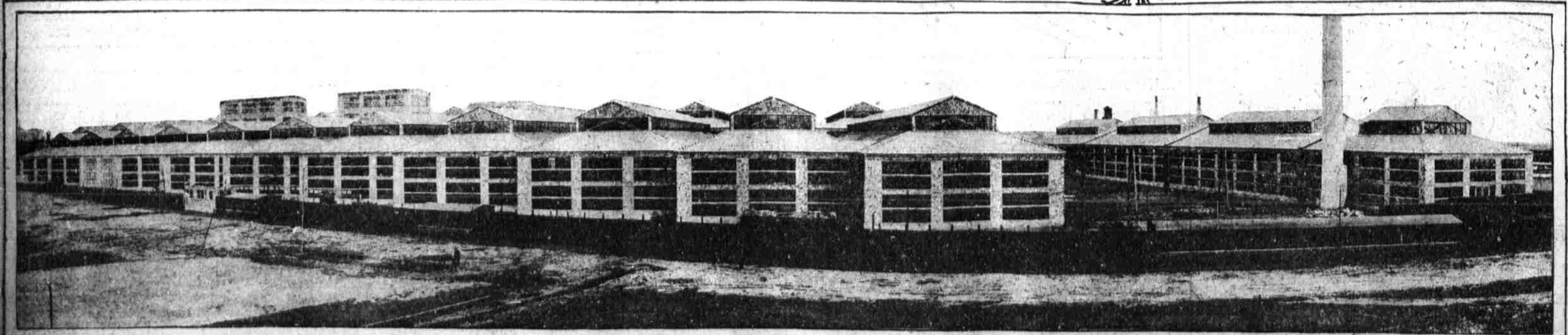
