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DESTROY BOLSHIEVIKI, PARIS PAPERS INSIST

Entente's Failure to Undertake Military Intervention Calls Forth Protests

By the Associated Press Paris, Dec. 27.—The announcement that the Entente policy was not to undertake immediate military intervention in Russia, has called forth protests from the Paris newspapers.

The Temps says that the Allies in permitting the Bolsheviki with German assistance to ravage and destroy the small sections of Russia, are sacrificing the peoples who might afford a basis for the reconstruction of Russia.

A representative in Paris of the Estonian Government is quoted as saying: "Although the Germans declared on November 14 that they would surrender the power in Estonia to the Estonian Government, the requisition of food and raw materials by the Germans continues."
