

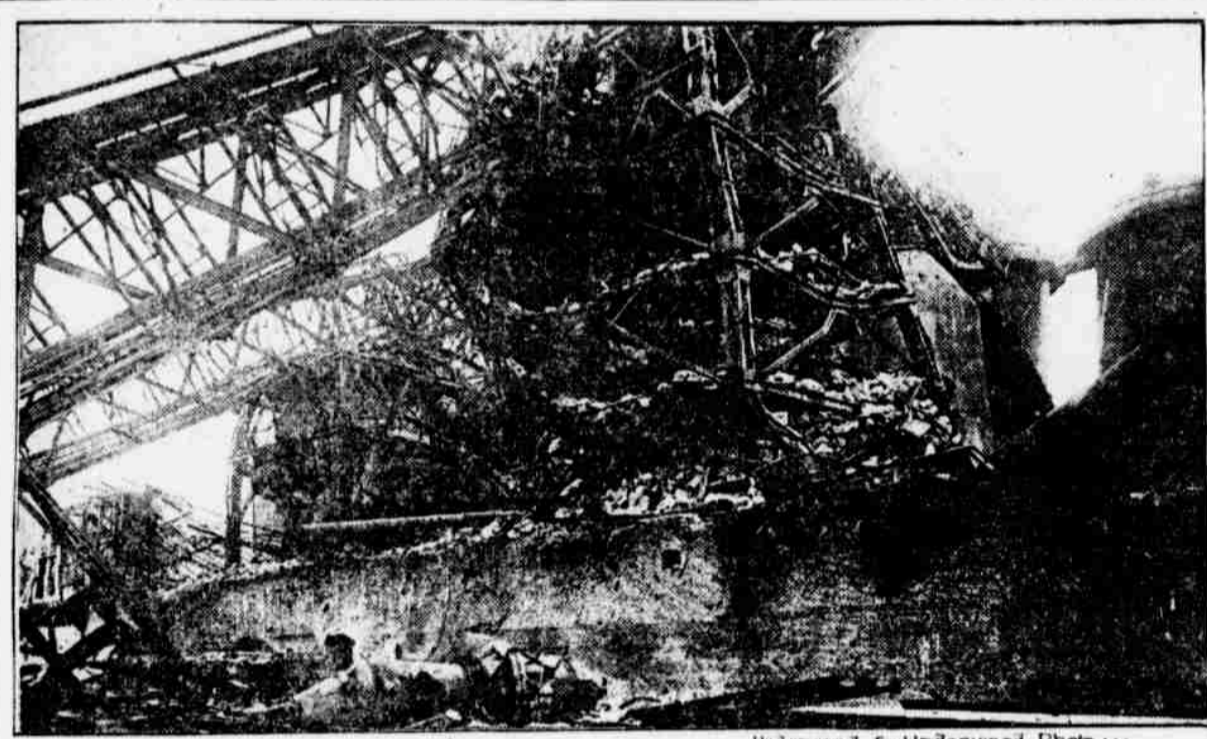
A Stately Cargo Carrier From Far Off Seas Features The Pictorial Resume of the Day



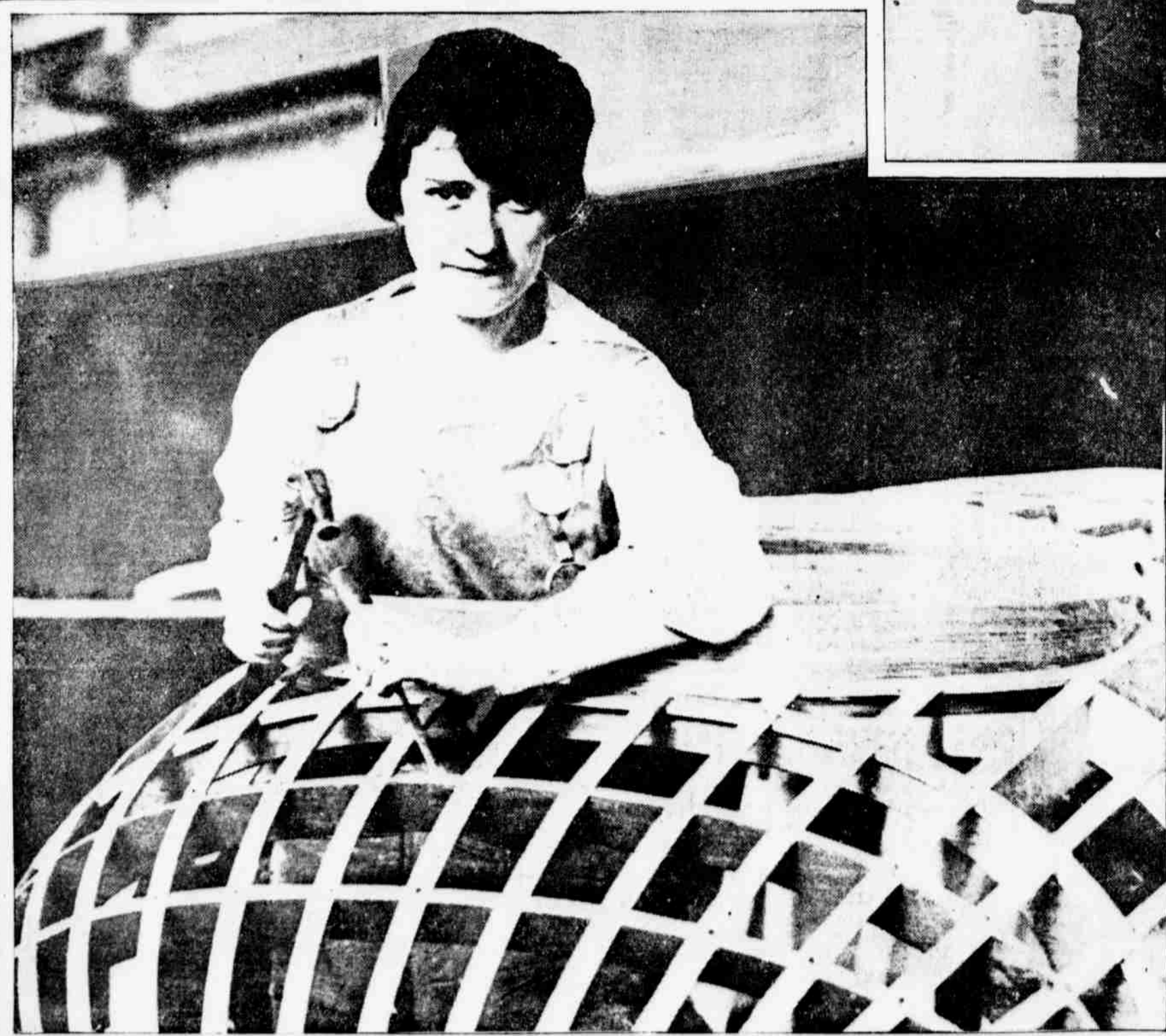
UNLOADING MANGANESE ORE from the hold of the bark Valparaiso, just in from South America, at her pier in Port Richmond, Philadelphia.
