By the Associated Press Washington, Jan. 23.—Withdrawal of the President's power to fix freight rates, provided by the railroad control act, and restoration of the authority of the courts and the Interstate Commerce Commission in regulating the operation of the roads was demanded by Clifford Thorne, representing various shippers, at the hearing before the Senate Interstate Commerce Committee today. Thorne said that no disaster among the shippers of the United States that were a popular vote taken today it would be defeated.
