pictures of sports in Florida will give the players the idea that they are fortunate indeed to have such a fine place for training. There will be keeping the boys satisfied.

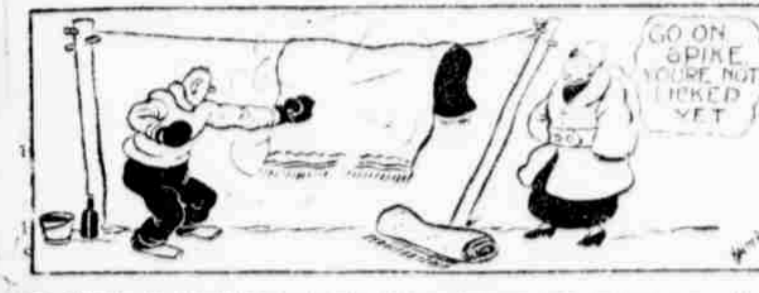

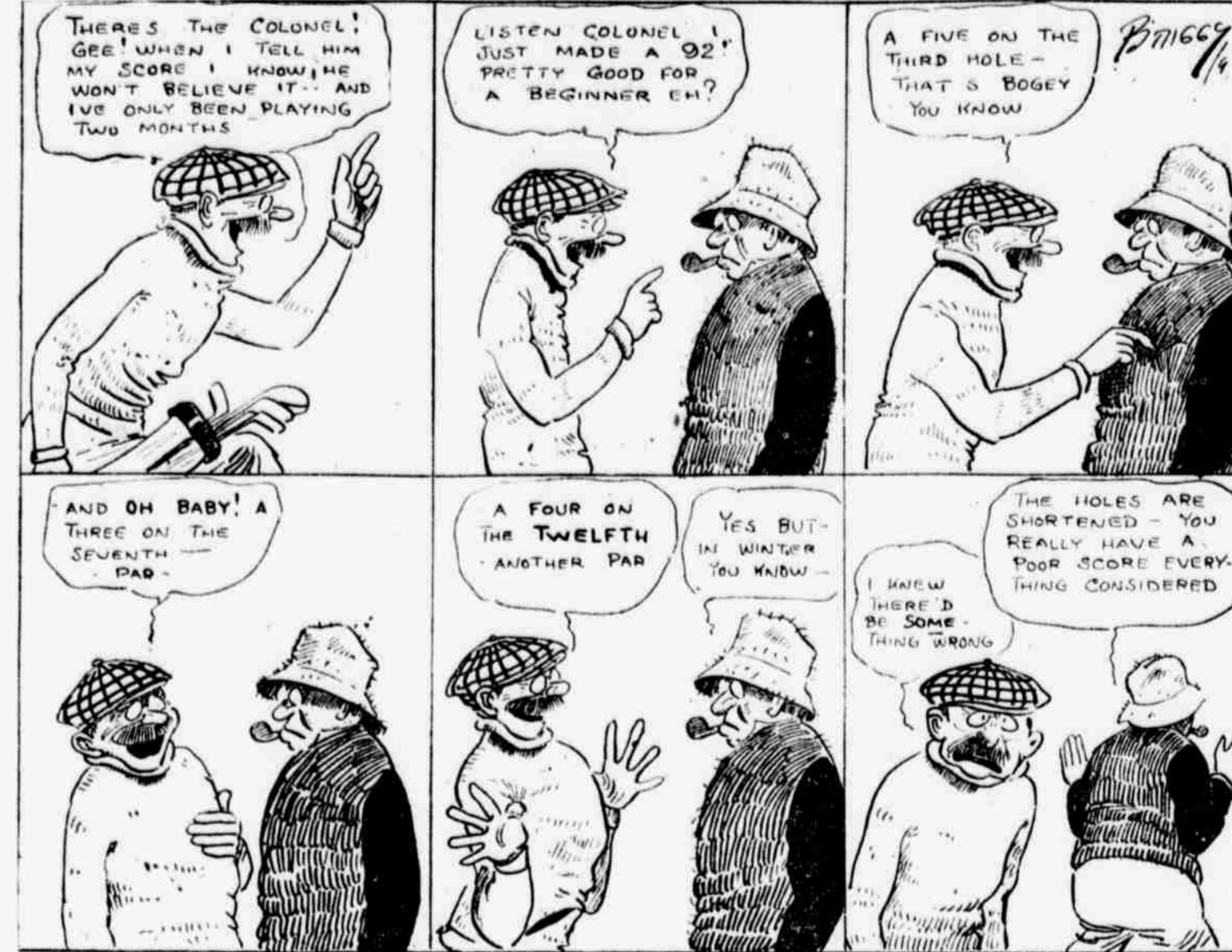

St. Joseph's and Gray will meet in a basketball game on May 1st. This will be a challenge to the Central team, and it is expected that St. Joe will win.

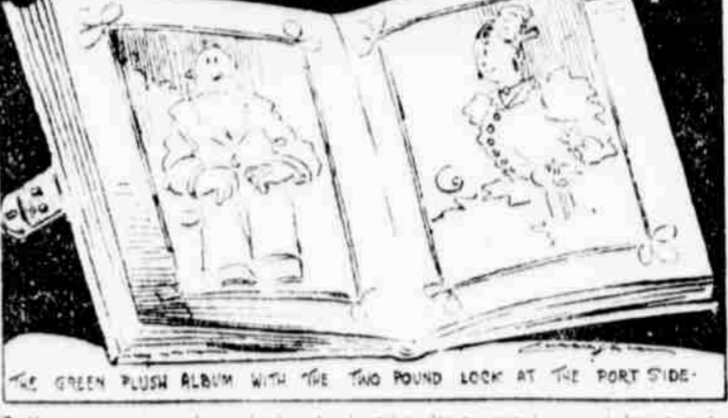
