

### THINK SLAIN MAN MISTAKE VICTIM

**Police Can't Find Motive for Murder of George Wilson**

### SHOT OUTSIDE SALOON

### Wife of Slain Man Is Ill and May Die From Shock

Huffed by the absence of all motive for the crime, members of the family of George Wilson, 192 Federal street, who was shot to death while leaving a saloon at the corner of Second and Mifflin streets, believe he had been murdered in mistake for some one else. Wilson was shot in front of a saloon at the southwest corner of Mifflin and Second streets, by some person who fired from a concealed location. The bullet pierced his abdomen, causing his death last night at the Mount Sinai Hospital. The shooting was done about an hour earlier.

### Say Dead Man Had No Enemies

Members of Wilson's family and his closest friends declare the dead man had no enemies. A few minutes before the shooting Wilson told a friend, a next-door neighbor, Edward Crossley, of 105 Federal street, that he was on his way to see a physician. Wilson had been suffering from slight fever, contracted while at work as a foreman in the drydock at Logan Island.

### Policeman Heard Shot

Street Sergeant Loesche and District Detective Henneke, of the Seventh and Carpenter streets police station, and Patrolman Brennan, of the Mifflin and Federal streets station, were standing only a few feet away from the scene and heard the shot. They saw Wilson fall and ran to his assistance, but every effort to locate the person who fired the shot failed after a thorough search.
