

CASUALTY LISTS HAVE 1812 NAMES

Roster for Afternoon Composed Almost Entirely of Wounded Men. Day's Total Swells War Department's Aggregate of Honor Roll to 238,240

Washington, Feb. 10.—Four casualty lists with 1812 names, all ranks, were released by the War Department today.

Summary of the totals are: Killed in action 21,217; Died of disease 19,194; Died from accident and other causes 2,768; Missing 13,180; Wounded 149,969; Grand totals 238,240.

MYSTERIOUS FATE OF HERO VETERAN

Harry I. Jacobs' Relatives Puzzled by Conflicting Official Reports. TWO FROM HERE KILLED Honor Roll of 1939 Names Includes 207 of Soldiers From Pennsylvania

Mystery surrounds the fate of Private Harry I. Jacobs, one of the Philadelphia boys who was among the first American soldiers to go overseas with General Pershing in August, 1917.

Three times have War Department messages been received by his mother, Mrs. Pearl Jacobs, 524 North Fifth street, concerning him, and each time the message has made the fate of the hero less definite. As last written in May, 1918, is the only one that his mother has received from her son since he sailed from this country.

The first official notice of Jacobs, dated December 17, said that he had been severely wounded on October 5. The second telegram from Washington reported him missing in action during the Meuse-Argonne campaign in December 1918. It was originally reported to have been wounded. An official notice just received states that Private Jacobs died, but falls to give the cause or date of his death.

It is reported that it has not been determined. Through the soldier's mother is perplexed over the various reports from the War Department, she hopes to hear from her son soon. She believes that he met some strange death soon after he arrived overseas.

Private Jacobs was a seasoned soldier. He had been in the army since the first days of the Mexican border in 1916, when he was assigned to duty at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, from where he was sent overseas in August, 1918.

Included in a total of 1939 names on the honor roll for Pennsylvania today. Of the 1939 names announced by the War Department, there are two deaths. One is reported killed in action and the other died of wounds.
