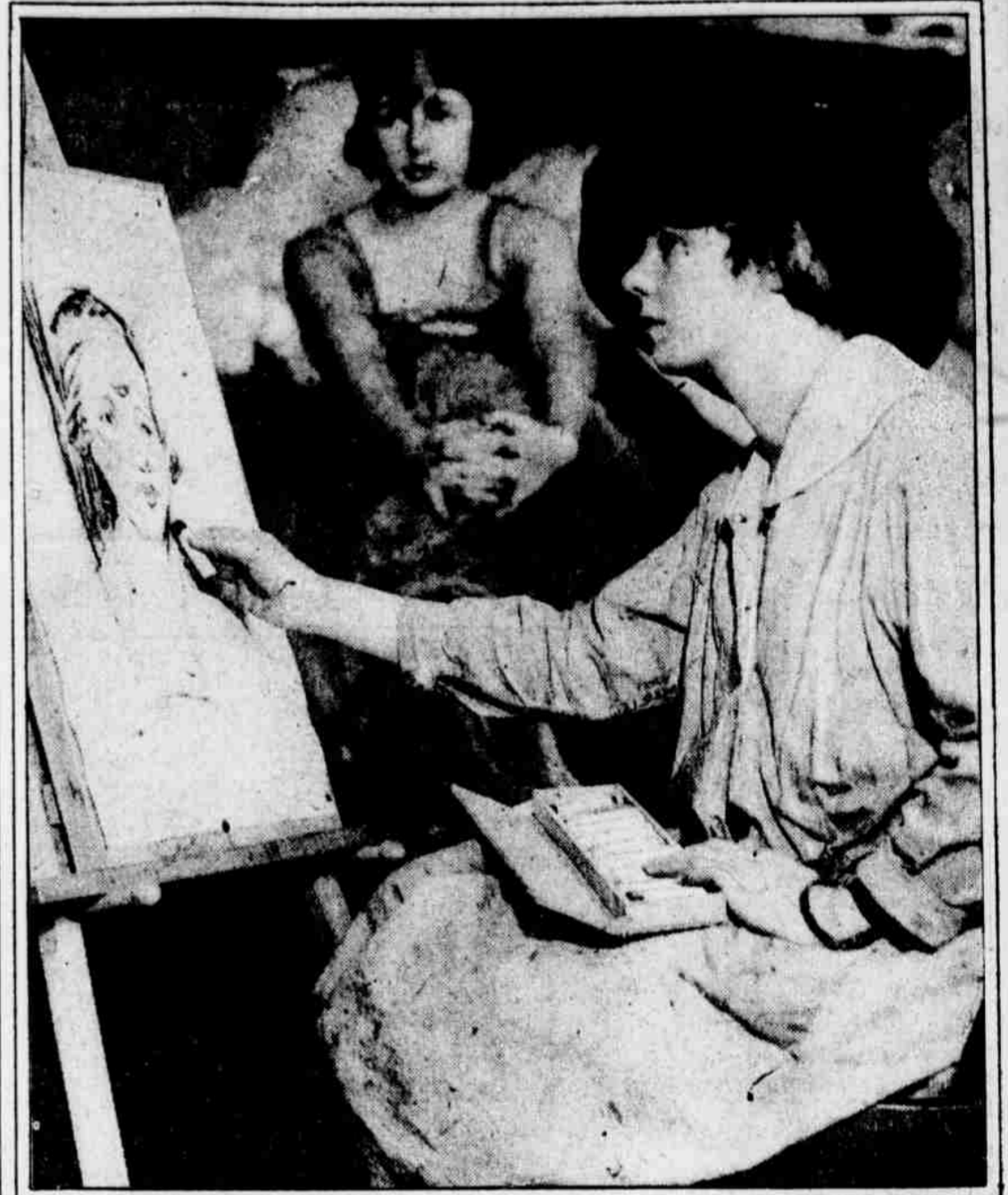


Navy Dirigible Fa'loon Makes Patriotic Visit to Capitol; French War Relief Tableaux

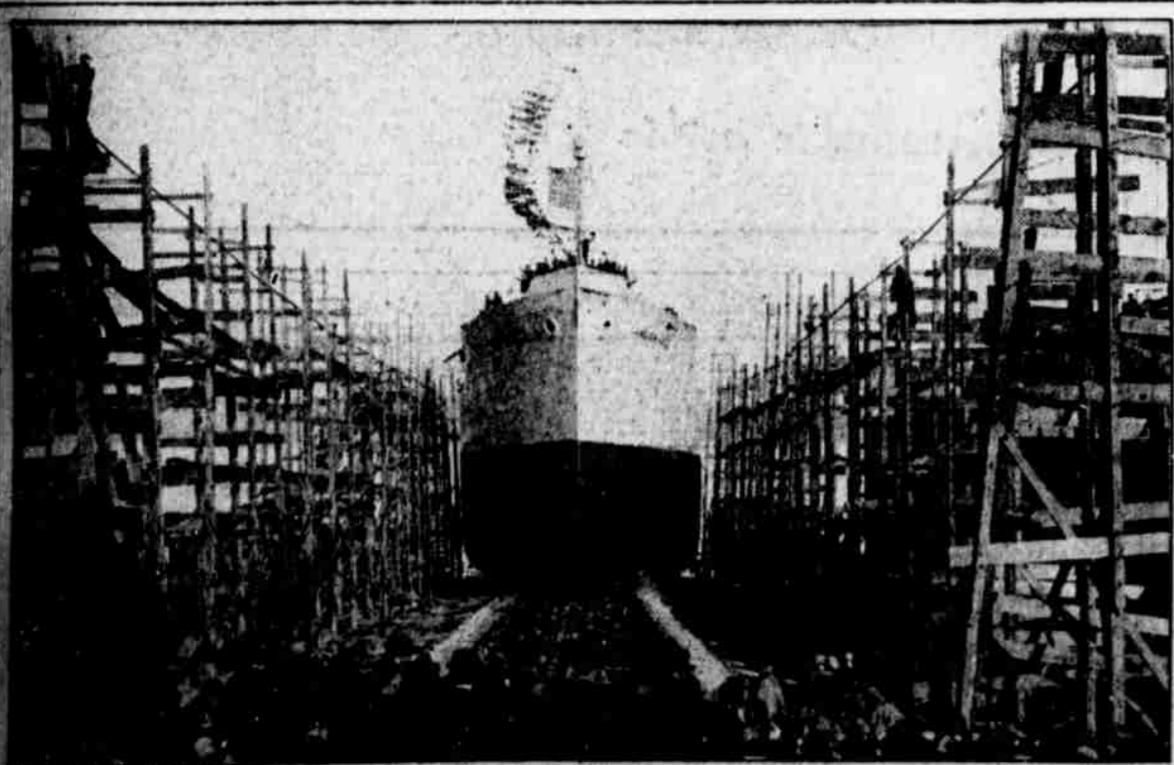
MRS. NICHOLAS ROOSEVELT in the Goya balcony scene tableaux at the ball last night given by the French war relief committee of the Emergency Aid.
