Air of Nobility Stands Out in Handsome Brown and White Dog, Which Is Held With Mongrels at City Refuge

SOMEWHERE in Philadelphia there is a master or mistress mourning the loss of Duke, the handsome brown and white collie now at the city pound, 5025 Clearfield street.

And, surrounded by a motley gathering of mongrels, hounds, terriers, poodles and spaniels, Duke sits his own throne and then to a pleading note, as though to ask when his happy home will be restored to him.

Mr. H. Shingle, keeper of the pound, is seeking the happy home. It was nearly six months ago that a man began calling the pound to ask if Mr. Shingle had seen his dog.

There is really an air of nobility about Duke. His distinguishing feature is a moon eye. His left eye is a beautiful brown, while the right is the moon eye.

Except for the Great Dane, which does guard duty each night, Duke is the largest and most majestic figure in the pound. He and his fellows quickly discredit the tales usually associated with city pounds.

In the first place it is a pound and not a pond, as many folk think. "Many years ago," explained Mr. Shingle, "this city did maintain a pond where stray dogs were drowned."

AUSTRIANS HORRIFIED AND HATED GERMANS

Philadelphia Lieutenant Lauds Italians in Writing of Comradeship

Mrs. Jones Winter has received the following letter from her grandson, Lieutenant William Weikman Farley, now with the American forces in Italy and attached to the ambulance service.

"Conditions have improved here greatly since the armistice was signed, and food is being rushed to Austria on large supply trains.

"When the Italians made their victorious advance, which, by the way, was on the same hammer-blow policy as that of Marshal Pochy in France, we were with them, crossing their famous Piave River, and we followed up, eventually wounded all the way into Austria.

"The Austrians seemed to have a fear and horror of the Germans, attributing most of the outrages to them. Many of the boys had been decorated for bravery, and this branch of the service can claim as many decorations proportionally as any brigade either here or in France.

"Everywhere you go in Italy the Italians seem anxious to do everything in the world for you, and the boys who have gone on furlough come back with marvelous tales of compliments and courtesies shown to them through Italy.

"I have many letters from friends in France. Some of them are on their way home. We expect to arrive home sometime in June, or perhaps sooner. There are many Philadelphians in this organization, so I guess we'll have a reception when we get home.

PARENTS PROTEST SCHOOL BUILDINGS

Alleged Insanitary Conditions Downtown to Be Presented to Education Board

Complaints against public schools in the section bounded by South street, Washington avenue, Broad street and the Delaware River will be presented to the Board of Education by members of the Home and School League of the Lyons Public School, Catharine street above Tenth.

Parents met last night in the Lyons school and drew up a petition of protest against alleged insanitary conditions there. A series of meetings has been planned and a committee of parents will inspect many of the schools in that section.

Conditions in many of the downtown schools are intolerable, according to Dr. H. P. Hurling, who was present at last night's meeting. He said many parents have taken their children from public schools because the school buildings are unsafe and insanitary.

"The specific protests we wish to present regard the intolerable conditions of the Lyons School, that is the physical condition of the building, due to age and neglect, causes the children to submit to an irremediable insanitary environment. There is falling plaster in all parts of the building and a dangerous inside stairway in addition to an unprotected smoke pipe that runs through a hall used by kindergarten children.

"There are poor lighting, poor desks, no playground, no water in any part of building and medical examinations are conducted in a room used by teachers as a kitchen, dining-room and a sleeping room.
