Heroic Records at Chateau-Thierry Set Down by Commander of the Sixth
It is generally recognized now that the gallantry and effectiveness in attaining objectives of the United States marines at the battle of Chateau-Thierry and the ensuing Marne country saved Paris, hardly more than two score miles away, and the goal of a gigantic Hun push, and thus proved one of the turning points toward Allied victory. Consequences of the War
