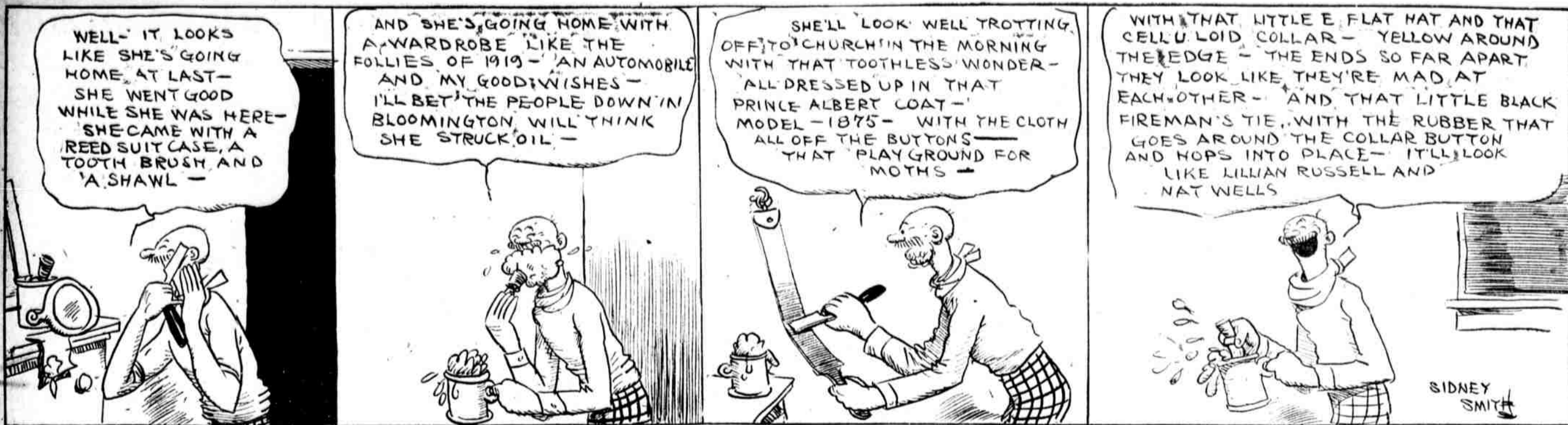

The Young Lady Across the Way



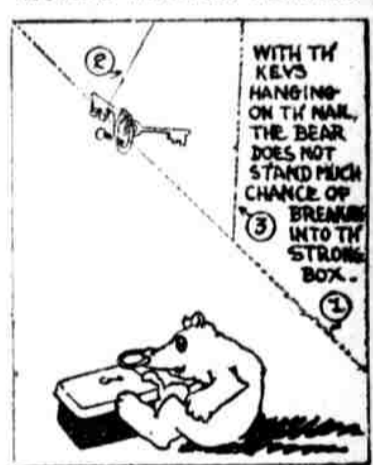
The young lady across the way says she saw in the paper that Captain Eddie Rickenbacker wore nine citations and she supposes one has to dress warmly up there.

The Boatman—Lor' bless yer, mum, the place's swarmin' wiv 'em 'ere's one comin' along now.



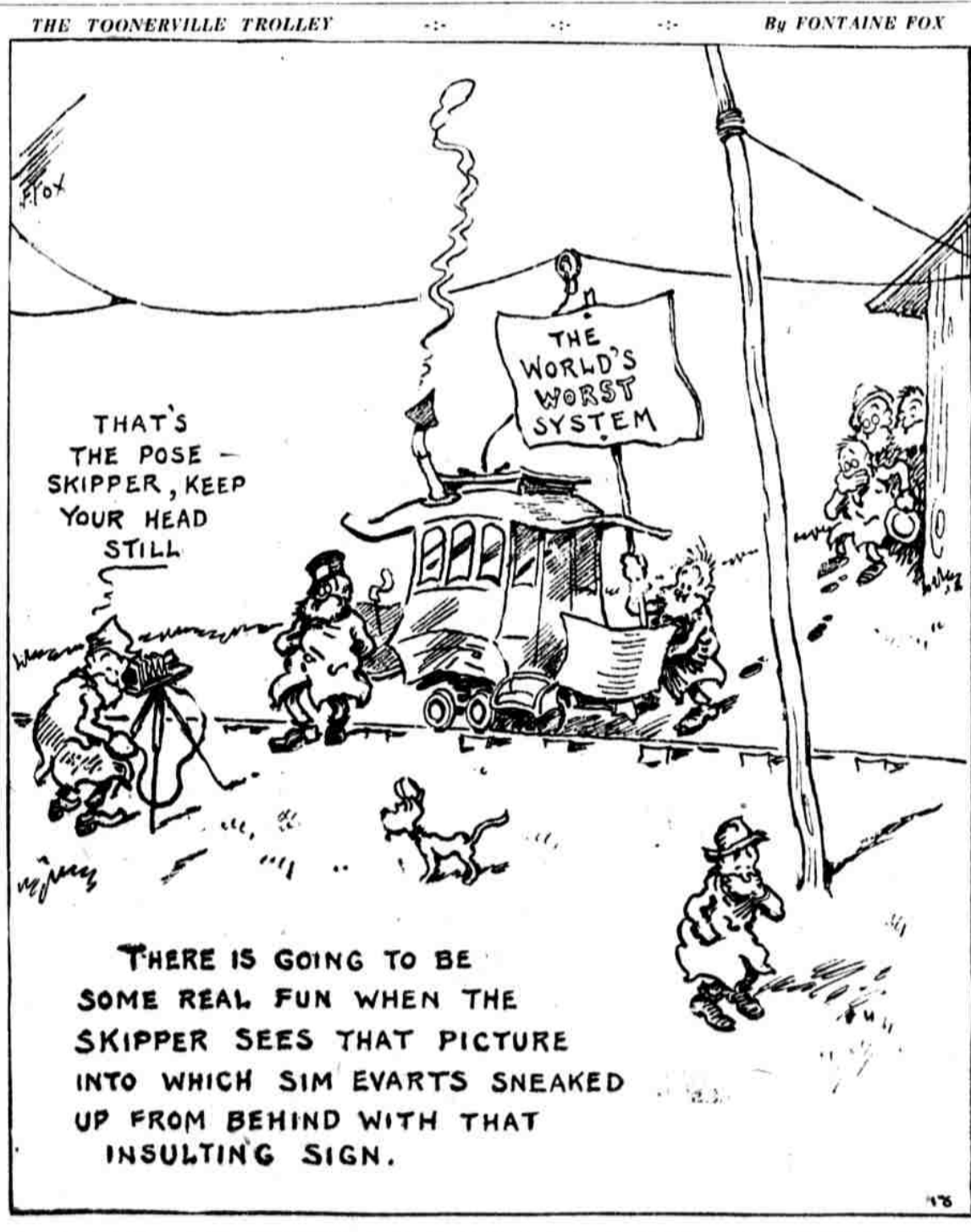
THE DELAYS OF DEMOBILIZATION
