Losses of Day Reported by the War Department
Number 444
DISEASE CLAIMS 104
Seven Killed in Action, 7 by Wounds and 57 by Accident; 267 Are Wounded

Washington, March 20.—Army casualties released by the War Department today number 444, 175 of whom are listed as dead.

Two hundred and thirty-eight of this total were in the morning report and 206 are in the afternoon record as followed: Killed in action, seven; died from wounds, seventy; died of disease, forty-seven; died from accident and other causes, twenty-four; wounded, 127.
