

DEAD MEN NAMED FOR CLASS HONOR

Penn Seniors Establish Precedent by Choosing War Heroes

VOTE WAS UNANIMOUS

Selections May Be Made To-day—Class Week Program Announced

The senior class of the University of Pennsylvania today established a precedent in the selection of "honorary men" by naming eight members of their class who were killed in action in France for the coveted honors.

Despite early rumors of opposition to the plan there was virtually no fight against the suggestion when the class met in Houston Hall.

The vote naming the dead soldiers for the honor positions in the class was unanimous.

The college seniors named were James A. Bunsack, Benjamin H. Boshorn, George W. Sassaman, Robert H. Pollock, Thomas Massey, Jr., Frank Walker, Ernest Wood and Thomas H. Evans. The names of these soldiers with five others, belonging to the medical and dental departments, appear on a bronze tablet in front of the library.

The opposition to the plan simmered down to a suggestion from several seniors that the honor positions in the class should be awarded for "living" activities and not for any act done outside of the University. There were numerous speeches in favor of the plan.

S. H. Siebert, speaking for the proposal, said that some of the senior class might come under the head of "war babies" since they had advanced in the class while other men had given their lives on the battlefield.

The resolution calling for a vote was introduced by Carlo Berguido. The meeting to elect the honor men

was called by Samuel R. Harrell, president of the senior class.

Students in favor of the plan said that instead of the election of "honorary men" called respectively "Bowl Man," "Spade Man," "Cane Man" and "Spoon Man," who are usually designated the four most popular men of the class, the seniors choose the "honorary men" from among the number who were killed in action or who died in the service of their country.

Many students believed the men who are now back with the graduating class are less deserving of this honor than those who sacrificed their lives during the war.

Last year was the first during which there was no election of "honorary men" because of unsettled conditions due to the war. It was decided to do away with the formality.

There are twelve seniors on the memorial tablet in front of the library who are listed as having lost their lives in service. Some of these are members of the dental and medical schools, whose class-day exercises are entirely separate from that of the college. Wharton School and Towns Scientific School.

The twelve members of the senior class, whose names appear on the memorial tablet, are: James A. Bunsack, Benjamin H. Boshorn, Francis P. Cooke, George W. Sassaman, Robert H. Pollock, Thomas Massey, Jr., Edward M. Smith, Abraham K. Street, Ivan E. Timmerlohn, Frank Walker, Ernest Wood, Jacob Zatin and Thomas H. Evans.

TROLLEY TRANSFER HEARING Business Men Will Go to Harrisburg Next Wednesday

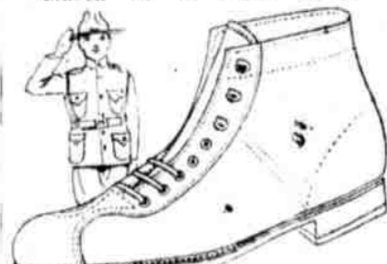
