IN ONE FAMILY**

Exceptional Heroism of
Three Other Philadel-
phians Recognized

MEDALS RECOMMENDED

John H. McFadden, Jr., Re-
ceived Cross for Ambu-
lance Corps Work

Five Philadelphians have been cited in dispatches and recommended for decorations, in recognition of exceptional heroism and bravery in action on the western front.

John H. McFadden, Jr., son of John H. McFadden, a well-known cotton merchant of this city, has received the Cross of the Legion of Honor for efficient service in the ambulance corps, according to a cablegram received by his parents.

Young McFadden served as a driver during the early days of the war, but later became treasurer of the fund which supports the field service, and on two occasions returned to America to enlist financial aid for the work. He was formerly a student at the University of Pennsylvania, and is the second member of his family to be decorated. His uncle, George McFadden, several days ago was awarded a distinguished service medal.

Sergeant Thomas A. O'Brien, 1100 Cantrell street, of Company A, 325th Infantry, has been recommended for the Distinguished Service Cross for exceptional courage displayed during the advance of his regiment at St. Juvin in October.

For extraordinary heroism in action Second Lieutenant George H. Howard, 224th Infantry, was awarded the cross. The officer's mother, Mrs. M. C. Howard lives at 3015 Ringgold street.

Sergeant Benjamin R. Bacon, of 2135 North Ninth street, Company D, 236th Infantry, was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for unusual bravery in action south of Champigneulle, France, on October 16.

Captain Mathias Willoughby Haney, of 5412 Angora terrace, was cited yesterday and awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for exceptional heroism in action at Montfaucon Hill, France, on September 26-28, 1918, with his regiment, the Thirty-ninth Infantry.

**MEMORIAL FUND GROWING
Lansdowne Committee Has \$5200
Toward \$10,000 Goal**

The Lansdowne memorial fund committee announced today it had obtained \$5200 toward its \$10,000 fund for the erection of a memorial to the 250 Lansdowne men who entered the service during the war. Interest in the movement is wide-

spread both among the families of those who were in the service and other members of the community. The memorial is to take the form of four bronze street lamps to be erected at the corner of Lansdowne and Baltimore avenues. On the lamps will be tablets containing the names of those who gave their lives and of those who went into the service.

Two local young men's clubs will give entertainments for the benefit of the fund. It is anticipated that the entire amount will be raised in two weeks. The design of the memorials has already been completed. Claude A. Simpser is chairman of the committee.
