The War Department made public two more casualty lists today. The report, which is made up of minor and major casualties, many of which already have been published, also contains current deaths and injuries and corrections to previous reports. In the tables, as in the ones issued yesterday, the names of many Philadelphians appear. The overseas army death roll for the city today follows:

Killed in action—Corporals William E. Lewis, 983 North Sixty-sixth street; Pastor P. Rados, 1027 Locust street; Charles C. Windsor, 352 Durfor street. Died of accident or other cause—Private Peter Longman, 2904 Pine street.

Corporal Lewis originally was reported wounded and Corporal Rados and Windsor previously had been reported dead, with cause of death undetermined.

Yankees Chase Them Along Rhine to Secure Helmets

Paris, April 11.—In correspondence of the Associated Press.—When German officials in the cities occupied by the Germans issued orders for policemen to don their pre-war uniforms they didn't realize what an attraction boche helmets have for Yankees.

German policemen were pushed all along the Rhine by Americans who couldn't resist the temptation to copy their helmets from the heads of live Germans.

As a consequence of the onslaughts made upon the policemen, American officers asked German officials to discontinue the use of helmets. Ordinary caps are far less attractive than helmets are targets for snipers, and peaceful German policemen are now able to walk their beats in safety and quiet.
