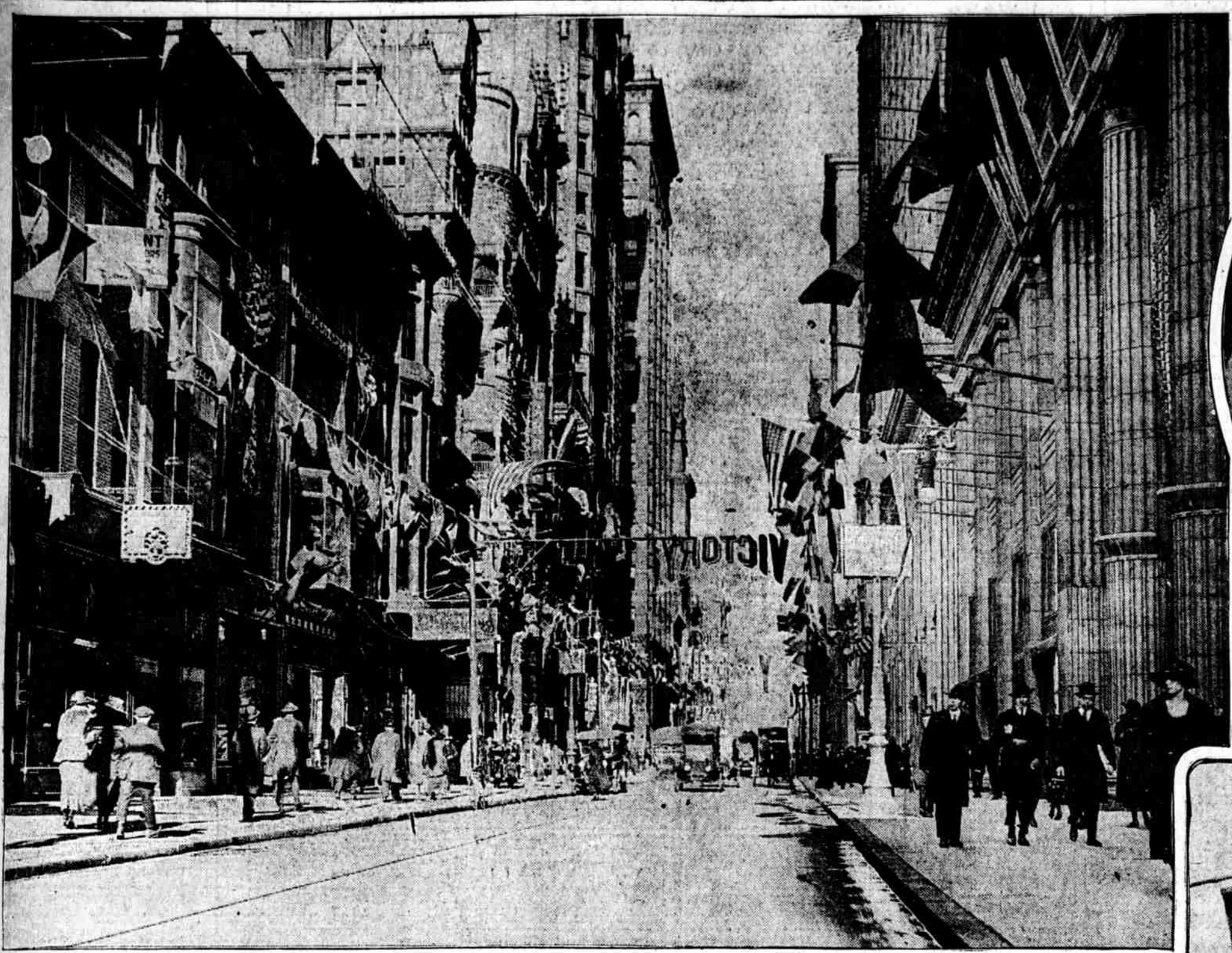
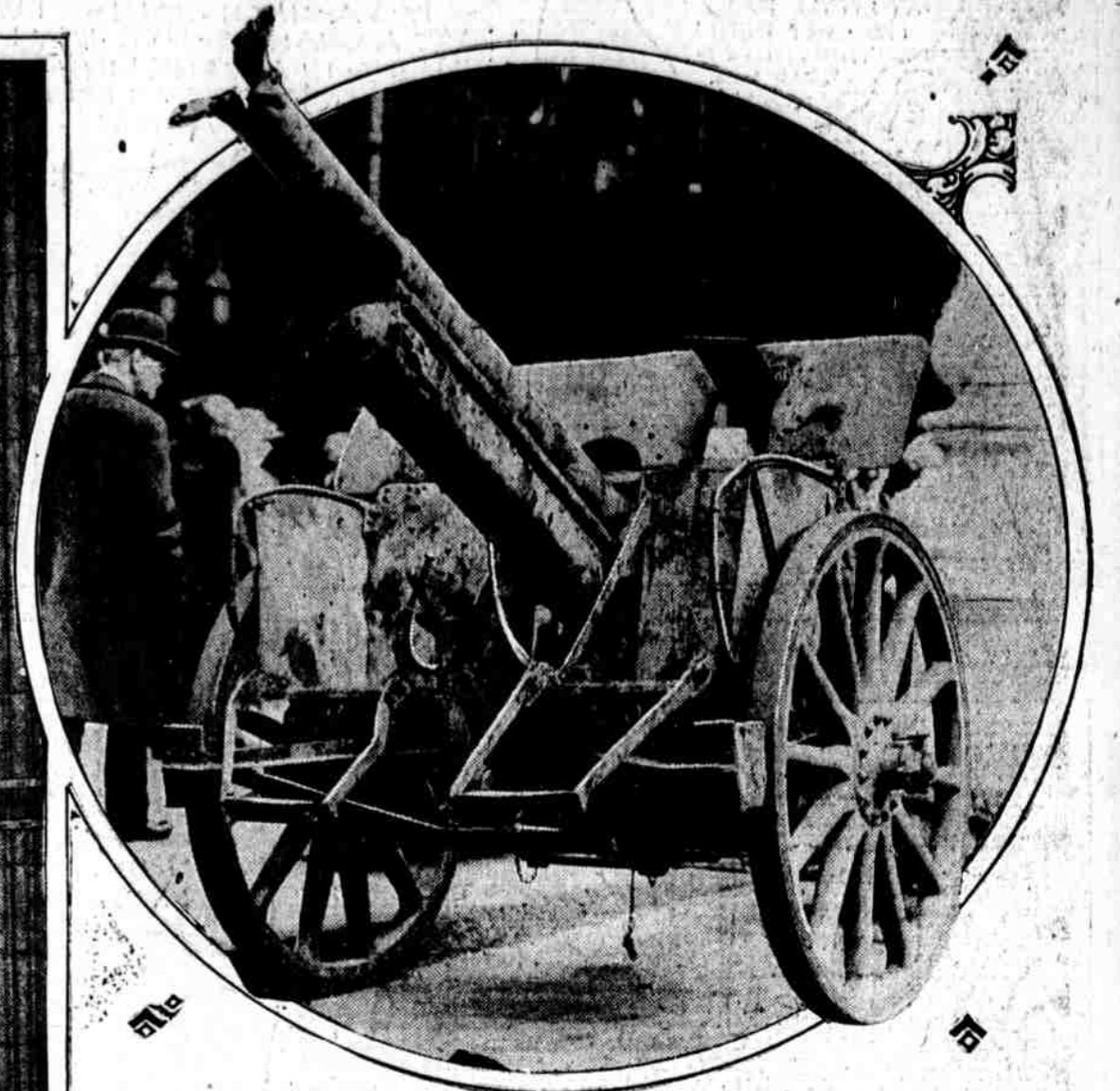


Opening of City's Victory Liberty Loan Campaign Dominates Photographic Review of Day

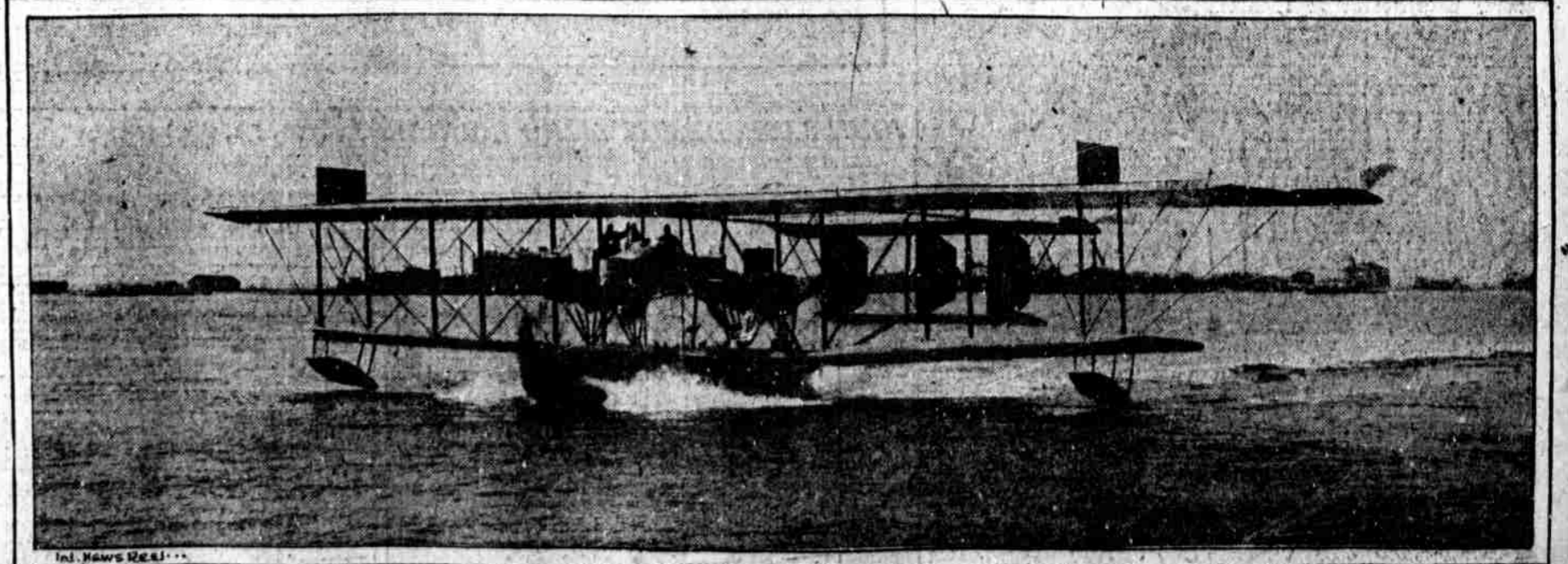
LADY DROGHEDA, a keen English airwoman, who did excellent service for the war funds with her aircraft exhibition in England and Ireland.
