

NO HOPE OF OASIS

AFTER JULY 1 SEEN

Congress at Extra Session Expected to Pass Legislation Enforcing Prohibition

LEADERS IN HOUSE AGREE

Washington, April 21.—There is nothing in the situation in connection with the wartime prohibition to go into effect July 1 or the national prohibition constitutional amendment which will take effect next January to furnish any foundation for the hope or expectation on the part of the wets that the United States will not become totally dry on July 1 and remain so forever, it was asserted today by E. T. Dinwiddie, secretary of the National Anti-Saloon League.

That this is the real situation in regard to the liquor question was admitted by Representative Frank W. Mondell, Republican House leader in the Democratic floor, who said he and Dinwiddie and Clark expressed their belief that between the time Congress meets at the extra session and July 1 it will pass unambiguously the necessary legislation to give the national prohibition authority and money needed to enforce the prohibition laws.

There is also no real ground for hope that the termination of the war in the near future may create an oasis between the coming of peace and the time when the national prohibition amendment becomes effective, Mr. Dinwiddie declared, because the wartime prohibition law does not provide that it shall remain in effect until the end of the war, but that it shall cease to be operative upon the termination of war and the declaration of the war must first be determined and proclaimed by the President.

"Congress has passed all the legislation necessary to make the United States 'dry' beginning July 1, together with penalties for violations," said Mr. Dinwiddie. "We have the failure to secure from leaders of the Republicans and Democrats in both the Senate and House that as soon as Congress meets in extra session legislation will be passed giving the Internal Revenue Bureau all the authority and money needed to enforce the law."

CHARLES B. RICHARDS

Noted Engineer, Once Philadelphian, Long a Professor at Yale

New Haven, Conn., April 21.—(By AP.)—Charles B. Richards, noted mechanical engineer, who was Higgins professor of mechanical engineering at Yale University for twenty-five years and emeritus professor for the last nine years, died at his home here yesterday at the age of eighty-five years. Before the age of thirty he invented the improved steam engine indicator, which France made him a Chevalier of the Legion of Honor. He was one of the founders of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers in 1881.

Professor Richards was born in Brooklyn. Before the Civil War he was connected with Colt's Patent Firearms Manufacturing Company in Hartford, but went to New York. When the Civil War broke out he returned to Colt's plant as assistant superintendent and consulting engineer. He remained until 1880, when he went to Philadelphia to be superintendent of a machine company. In 1884 the Sheffield Scientific School of Yale offered him the Higgins chair of mechanical engineering, and Mr. Richards gave up his business life. Besides the steam indicator he perfected a platform scale-testing machine and was granted patents for microscope appliances. He was consulting engineer in the construction of the state capital at Hartford and several Yale buildings.

REV. FRANCIS D. HOSKINS

Retired Episcopal Minister Dies in Episcopal Hospital

The Rev. Francis David Hoskins, a retired Episcopal minister, died on Saturday in the Episcopal Hospital, where he had been a patient a month. He had spent the winter in Florida, but when his health declined came here for treatment. His funeral will be held tomorrow at 10 a. m. at the home of his nephew Francis H. Earp, 1817 Mount Vernon street. Interment will be in Lancaster. Mr. Hoskins is survived by two sons, Francis E. Hoskins and Thomas E. F. Hoskins, both of this city.

Mr. McKeever contributed many articles to the Chester newspapers, writing both prose and verse.
