

WARTIME FRIENDS IN REUNION HERE

**Officer Who Dared Great Odds
Before Metz Is Visiting Lt.
Harvey Moore**

WAS WOUNDED IN ACTION

A friendship which began in the officers' training camp at Oglethorpe, Ga., and was severed in the front-line trenches at Metz by a German shell, was renewed today when Lieutenant Fjord G. Hoenshine, of the Fifty-fifth Infantry, arrived in this city to visit Lieutenant Harvey Moore, son of Congressman J. Hampton Moore, who was recently discharged from the service. Hoenshine, whose home is in Winder, near Johnstown, Pa., and Moore won their commissions together and were assigned to the same regiment. Both became gas officers on their arrival in France, Hoenshine in charge of the first and Moore in charge of the second battalions of their regiment. Their companies were C and H, respectively.

Early in October Hoenshine's unit went into the front-line trenches and Moore's acted as its support. On October 26 Lieutenant Moore was injured to relieve Hoenshine and, advancing ahead of his unit, learned that his friend had been carried off the field the night before during a raid. "There were sixty of us who volunteered to secure the information from the Germans," said Lieutenant Hoenshine today. "We were out on what

was believed to be the last trip into No Man's Land for information prior to our big drive on the famous fortress. We had crossed the open and had cut through the first of the German wires at the entrance to a tunnel under a hill on which the Germans were entrenched, when one of my men and myself came upon a German. He refused to surrender and there was but one thing to do—kill him and take a chance, because once he spread the alarm the Germans would cut off several of our men who were beyond the wires.

"We did our duty, but the Germans discovered us and there was a free-for-all fight. I was caught between our men and several Germans, and a machine gun bullet went through my left arm and an explosive bullet entered my right hip."

As a result of the latter wound, Lieutenant Hoenshine lost several pounds of flesh which the surgeons were compelled to cut out because gangrene set in following the explosion of the bullet in his body.

He was invalided home after spending several months in a French hospital, and has since been an inmate in a hospital in Pittsburgh. "You don't realize the value of friendship until you have gone through the thing from bottom to top," he added, "that's why I had to come to Philadelphia as soon as I got out of the hospital at Pittsburgh." Lieutenant Hoenshine will be Lieutenant Moore's guest at the latter's home, Thirtieth street and Chelton avenue, for several days.

Italian Shot in Card Game Dies
Joseph Trovelli, forty-eight years old, of 522 Christian street, who was shot during a card game on April 6 in the home of a neighbor, died in Mount Sinai Hospital, Joseph Fayello, fifty years old, of 518 Christian street, who fired the shot, was arrested at the time of the shooting. Magistrate Coward, in the Seventh and Carpenter streets station, held him without bail to await the action of the coroner.
