

### WOMAN GIVES ALARM OF BRUTAL ROBBERY

Garage Employee, Beaten on Head, May Have Fractured Skull

### TWO SUSPECTS ARRESTED

Alarm given by a woman motorist early today led to the discovery of a brutal hold-up in a North Broad street garage and the arrest of two men on suspicion of participating in the robbery.

The victim of the assault and theft is Foster Moore, 1515 Rowan street, Nicetown. He is in St. Luke's Homeopathic Hospital in a semi-conscious condition, suffering from injuries about the head, which physicians say, indicate a fractured skull.

William Parker, a negro, nineteen years old, of Nineteenth and Panama streets, and Charles Myers, twenty-two years, Thirteenth and Rush streets, were held without bail by Magistrate Penock for further hearing. Parker was partially identified by Moore. A third participant in the crime is sought by the police.

Patrolman Hamilton, Branchtown station, was accosted near Broad and Rockland streets about 2:30 o'clock this morning by a woman in an auto, who told him a man was being attacked in a garage at 4610 North Broad street. The woman said she had stopped there to buy oil and had witnessed the assault. She drove away while Hamilton hastened to the scene.

He found Moore, who is employed at the garage, lying on the floor, his hands and feet bound, and an auto duster tied about his face. His head and body were bruised and bleeding.

An auto axle, the weapon used, lay nearby. Moore was unconscious.

Hamilton, after sending the injured man to the hospital, arrested Parker and Myers, whom he found in the neighborhood.

Moore, after partially reviving, told Detectives Reeves and Graham that he had been beaten and robbed of \$5.64 by three men, who entered the garage ostensibly to purchase gasoline. As he turned to serve them, he said, he was struck over the head with the axle.

The identity of the woman who notified Hamilton is not known to the police.

L. R. Baker, 5732 Walnut street,

was held up and robbed this morning by two armed men who leaped from an automobile at Farragut and Chestnut streets. They flashed revolvers in Baker's face and demanded his valuables. He was robbed of \$7 in money and a watch and chain valued at \$25. The highwaymen were dressed in fur coats, according to Mr. Baker.

The churches include the Northern Presbyterian Church, Southern Presbyterian Church, United Presbyterian Church, the Canadian Presbyterian Church and the three branches of the Reformed Church.

Jenkins, of the Agricultural Department of the Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, at the "More-Sheep-More-Wool" convention yesterday told the meeting of animal specialists that the kind of animals a man raises goes a long way to indicate the kind of personality and taste he has.

"Of course," said Mr. Jenkins, "it may work just the other way. That is, the kind of character a man has may determine the kind of animals and vegetables he's destined to grow."

"I've toured this country fairly extensively and I have watched the various types of farmers, and the man who keeps bees and the man who cultivates strawberries invariably doesn't drink. Go to the livestock exhibitions. Look at the farmers who hang around the Holstein cows, and you'll find them excellent specimens of the horny-headed sons of toil. But take a walk around to the other side where the Jerseys are quartered and you'll see the frock-coat, high-silk-hat banker-type of farmer."
