Mayor Hylan Signs Bill Permitting Major League Ball on Sabbath

New York, May 2.—Mayor Hylan made Sunday baseball in this town an assured fact yesterday when he signed the ordinance adopted by the board of aldermen at their meeting last Tuesday. The law becomes effective immediately. The ordinance permits the same charge for admission as on week days.

There is not the slightest doubt that the first of these games will be played this Sunday both at the Polo Grounds and Ebbets Field, Brooklyn. The rain of yesterday forced a postponement and the clubs will be able to play off the postponed game on Sunday. This means the Phillies will meet the Giants and Brooklyn will face the Braves.

Some glad news hopped into the Giants' office yesterday. Javan Maxine announced that Philie Porritt and Fred Toner, his two star right-handers, had accepted terms and would join the club in a few days.

Davey Robertson, right fielder of the local club, who has been absent since 1917, reported today. As this will give McGraw six outfielders, it is quite likely that Robertson will be used in a trade to bring another experienced pitcher to the Giants.
