Continued From Page One ment of her war debts, through the heavy support given her by the American delegates, was another development of an auspicious day.

Basis of Compromise The note sent by Premier Orlando to Paris Sunday indicated an intention to treat with the other powers on the basis of a letter drawn up by Arthur J. Balfour, the British foreign secretary, which Premier Clemenceau and Lloyd George handed him on the eve of his departure from Paris, according to "Portland" in the Echo de Paris today.

The Italians, says the writer, will agree to make certain sacrifices in Dalmatia, so as to attain their project, the acquisition of Fiume, "even should they have recourse to those transitional formulas which the league of nations has furnished to the peace treaty."

Germans Talk of Quitting A German wireless dispatch received here last evening says: "If the delay continues at Versailles it is contemplated that Berlin will recall the German delegates, in which case they would be invited to Versailles again when the Allied governments are ready to negotiate."

A dispatch to the London Central News from Copenhagen quotes a Berlin newspaper as saying that the German peace delegation has sent an ultimatum to the Entente Allies, demanding a reply by 5 o'clock Monday afternoon, in which it was declared that the Germans would be obliged to return to Berlin in the event of a further postponement in the submission of the peace terms.

A semi-official announcement from Berlin says the peace negotiations will be in no way affected by the departure of the German ministers Landsberg and Gieseler from Versailles.

No announcement has been received here that Herr Landsberg and Herr Gieseler have left Versailles or that it was their intention to depart.

When the German delegates enter the dining room of the Hotel "Financ" on Wednesday afternoon to receive the text of the treaty they will find the representatives of the powers arrayed against Germany awaiting them at one of the great tables which have been placed in the room.

The Germans will not join the Allied delegates at this time, but will be conducted to a smaller table standing by itself at the open end of the great horseshoe formed by the green-covered tables arranged for the meeting.

Next to these will be the representatives of Italy, Belgium, Brazil, Greece, Portugal and Serbia. On the left side and seated below the delegates of Great Britain will be those of the British dominions, Japan, Poland, Rumania and Czechoslovakia.

Stage Set for Treaty Two tables have been placed for the general secretaries of the inter-Allied Council directly behind President Wilson and Premier Lloyd George. Secretaries of individual delegations will have seats at the sides of the round table behind their respective delegations.

Only six of the principal German delegates have secretaries, official interpreters and official stenographers. They will be admitted out of the large German delegation.
