LUXURY TAX REPEAL SOUGHT IN CONGRESS

Representative Moore Introduces Resolution Killing Section 904 of Revenue Bill

Washington, May 19 .- A resolution o repeal section 904 of the Kitchin revenue law was introduced at the opening of the session of Congress to-day by Congressman J. Hampton Moore. Philadelphia, a Republican member of the ways and means committee.

This section is generally known as the "luxury tax" section. It pertains to the 10 per cent tax on the excess of prices on certain articles, such as carpets, picture frames, valies, umbrellas, men's and women's hats, coats and shoes, boys' neckties, kimonos, petticoats and the like. It does not apply to jewelry.


