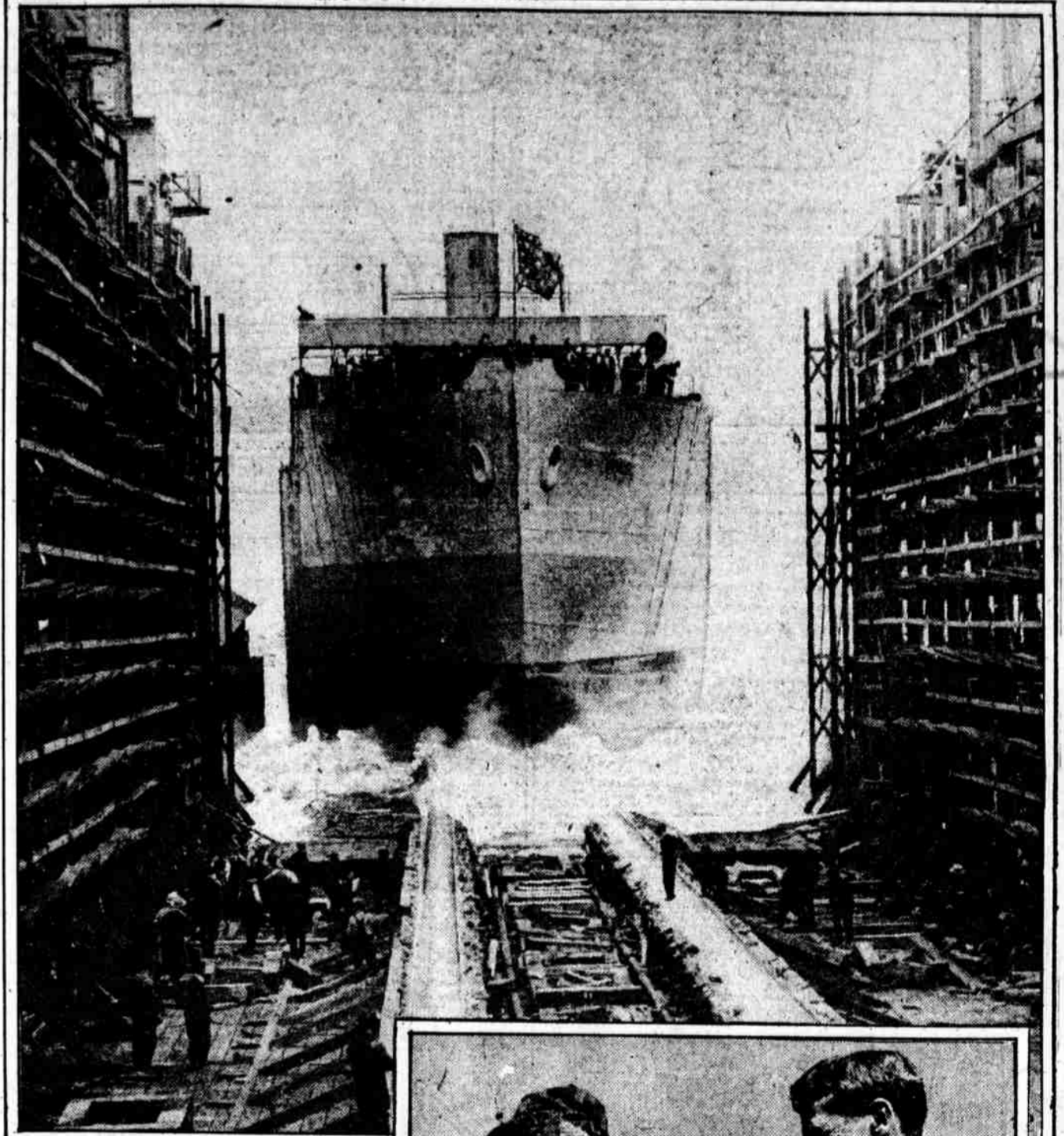
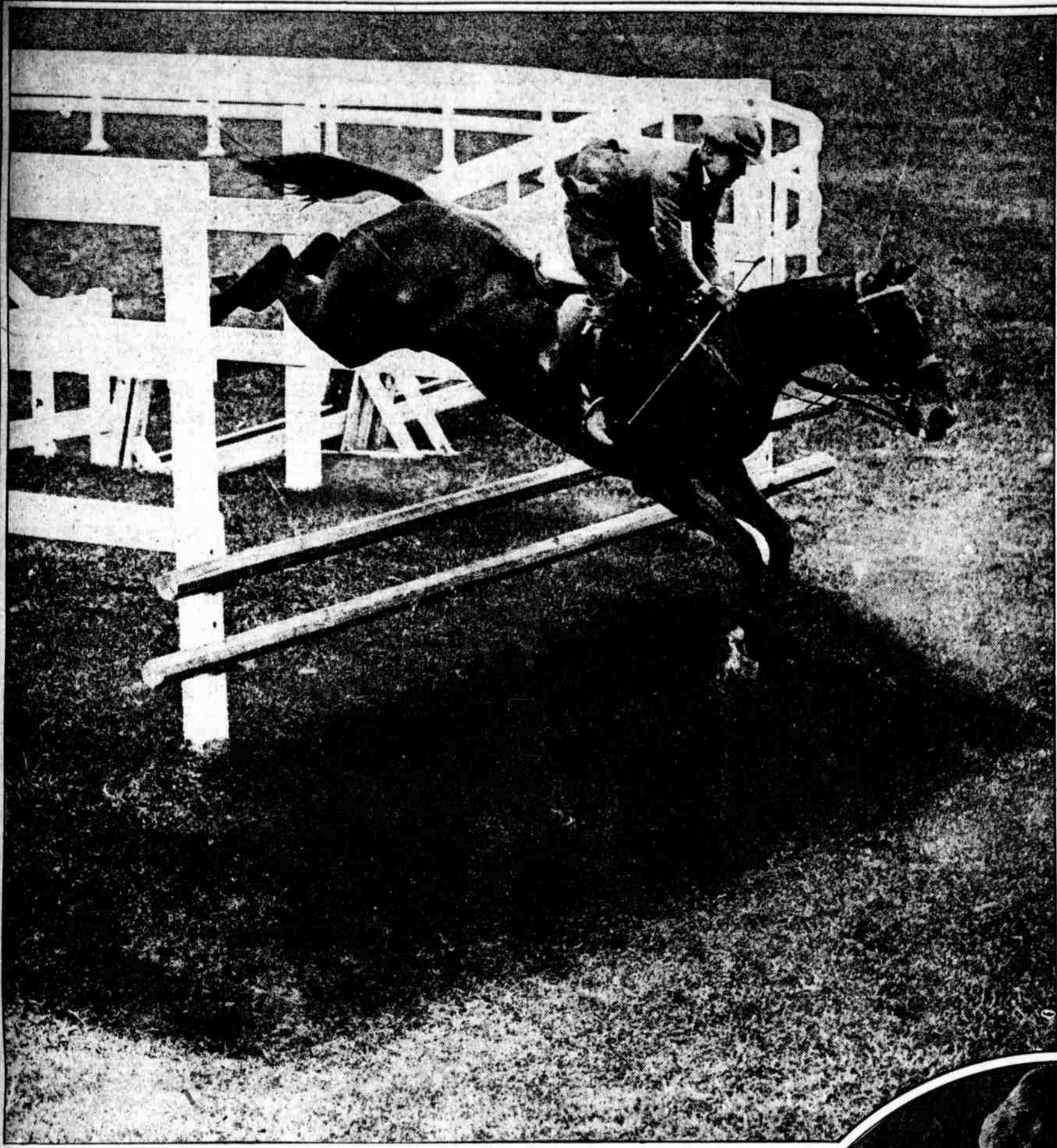


"Ogontz" Launched at Hog Island : Thrilling Jump at Devon : News of Day at a Glance
