

"YOUNGEST" CHURCH FIRST IN IRISH DRIVE

St. Carthage Workers Obtain \$1882 for Freedom Fund. Totals \$95,000 Here

CAMPAIGN ENDS TONIGHT

The Catholic Church of St. Carthage, Sixty-third and Cedar avenue, one of the "youngest" in the archdiocese, head the list of parishes in collections for the Friends of Irish Freedom campaign for \$150,000 here for Irish propaganda, according to announcement today from headquarters. The list includes only those churches which have already reported their totals to the committee. Many others have large subscriptions to their credit which will be reported before the close of the drive tonight with a banquet in the Continental Hotel.

Table listing church names and their contributions to the campaign, including St. Carthage, St. Anthony, St. Vincent, etc.

The executive committee of the campaign reports having collected \$302,500. More than \$45,000 was subscribed on the opening night of the drive. Many other large individual subscriptions have since been collected, but these will not be made known until tonight because of the desire of the workers to keep their collections a secret until the "last minute."
