

### CHURCHWOMEN ASKED TO BACK CITY LOAN

Krusen Requests Them to Urge Their Councilmen to Support Measure

### BETTER HOUSING FORECAST

Director Krusen today urged the churchwomen to prevail upon members of Councils to vote for the passage of the proposed \$14,750,000 loan, in answer to the letter of Mrs. Katharine E. Abbey, chairman of the Churchwomen's Housing Committee, which asked the director for "something definite" to better conditions.

The measure contains items for the construction of sewers, and for the abatement of nuisances, which he regards as the proper solution of the housing problem.

In his letter to Mrs. Abbey, the director says:

"Your letter received. Our plan for action in the housing situation was fully explained by the chief of the Bureau of Health, the Bureau of Surveys and the Bureau of Water."

"One of the most practical things that your housing committee can do is to get in touch with the members of Councils and urge the passage of the loan bill, so that we may have money for the construction of sewers and for an additional appropriation for the abatement of nuisances."

"Every effort is being made by the division of housing and sanitation to abate reported nuisances as rapidly as our means will permit. The publicity given to this work by the churchwomen's committee has been of aid to this department."

"I shall be glad to write you from time to time of additional work that may be done by your committee."

**Health Stations Opened**  
The Department of Health of Pennsylvania has opened health stations at the following hospitals: Jefferson, Polyclinic, Medical-Chirurgical and Germantown for the use of discharged soldiers and civilians. There is no charge for service or treatment.

Streets Empty, for Youngsters Were at Recreation Center

Mothers who lived in the vicinity of Fourth and Green streets yesterday afternoon called in vain for their children; the corner groceryman who wanted a special errand performed could find none of the small boys generally around to make a spare dime; automobile drivers and motorists whose routes lay in the neighborhood had no fear of running down children—all because the Friends' Neighborhood Guild playground at Fourth and Green streets opened for the summer.

Yesterday marked the seventh annual opening of that amusement center, which is a recreation place for hundreds of Russian, Rumanian, Lettish, Croatian, Jewish and Italian children during the season. The playground is situated on the site of what was once a Friends' meeting house, erected 100 years ago.

Miss Louise M. Layton, superintendent of the guild, and her two assistants kept things "humming."

The playground will be open every afternoon from 3:30 to 5:30 until the summer vacation begins, when it will be open all day. In the evenings it will be open from 7 to 8:30 o'clock for the older boys who work during the day.
