URSINUS GIVES LL. D. DEGREE TO MOORE

Phila. Congressman Urges Tolerance for Opponents of Entangling Alliances

Collegeville, June 11.—World conditions and legislation at Washington were discussed by Congressman J. Hampton Moore, of Philadelphia, in his commencement address at Ursinus College, which today conferred upon him the degree of doctor of laws.

Admiring the young men and women who were equipping themselves for the world's service that adherence to moral principles is better than the mere acquisition of wealth, the Congressman said that profiteers and self-seekers had undoubtedly made progress during the war, and that some of them had been showing the real heroes out of place.

He commended Ursinus for its firm devotion to Christian principles, as laid down by its founders fifty years ago, but asserted that all churches and colleges had been put to their severest test during the war.
